Amending the act of July 9, 1987 (P.L.220, No.39), entitled "An 2 act licensing and regulating the practice of social work; 3 providing penalties; and making an appropriation, " further providing for restrictions on the use of title "licensed 5 marriage and family therapist," for penalties and for unlawful practice; and providing for unlicensed practice 6 prohibited. 7 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. Section 16 of the act of July 9, 1987 (P.L.220, 11 No.39), known as the Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists and Professional Counselors Act, added December 21, 12 1998 (P.L.1017, No.136), is amended to read: 13 14 Section 16.2. Restriction on the use of [title "Licensed 15 Marriage and Family Therapist."] certain titles. 16 No person shall use a title or description, such as licensed "marital or marriage therapist, counselor, advisor or 17 18 consultant," "family therapist or counselor," "couples therapist 19 or counselor, " "martial or marriage and family therapist, counselor advisor or consultant" or any other name, style or 20

- 1 <u>description denoting that the person is a licensed marriage and</u>
- 2 <u>family therapist unless authorized by this act.</u> Only individuals
- 3 who have received licenses as licensed marriage and family
- 4 therapists under this act may style themselves as licensed
- 5 marriage and family therapists and use the letters "L.M.F.T." in
- 6 connection with their names. It shall be unlawful for an
- 7 individual to style oneself as a licensed marriage and family
- 8 therapist, advertise or offer to engage in the practice of
- 9 marriage and family therapy or counseling or use any words or
- 10 symbols indicating or tending to indicate that the individual is
- 11 a licensed marriage and family therapist without holding a
- 12 license in good standing under this act.
- 13 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 14 <u>Section 16.4 Unlicensed practice prohibited.</u>
- 15 (a) General rule. -- No person shall commence the practice of
- 16 marriage and family therapy in this Commonwealth, unless the
- 17 person holds a valid license as provided in this act.
- 18 (b) Nonapplicability. -- Subsection (a) shall not apply to:
- 19 <u>(1) A person practicing marriage and family therapy as</u>
- 20 part of the person's duties as an employee of:
- 21 (i) a recognized academic institution, school entity
- or Federal, State, county or local governmental
- 23 institution or agency while performing those duties for
- which the person was employed by the institution, entity,
- 25 agency or facility; or
- 26 <u>(ii) an organization which is nonprofit and</u>
- 27 <u>determined by the State board to meet community needs</u>
- 28 <u>while performing those duties for which the person was</u>
- 29 <u>employed by the agency; or</u>
- 30 (2) A person who holds a valid license or is certified

or regulated pursuant to another professional licensure law

or State certification of this Commonwealth and who provides

services within the person's scope of practice or employment

(3) A person who holds a valid license or is certified or regulated pursuant to another professional licensure law or State certification of this Commonwealth and who has met the rigorous standards and training in marriage and family therapy to be credentialed by the American Association of Marriage and Family Therapists as a Clinical Fellow.

- (4) A person who is a rabbi, priest, minister or member of clergy of any religious denomination or sect, if the activities and services that the person performs are within the scope of the performance of the regular or specialized ministerial duties of an established and legally recognizable church, denomination or sect and the person performing the services remains accountable to the established authority of the church, denomination or sect.
- (5) A person who is a student, intern or trainee who is pursuing a course of study in marriage and family therapy at an accredited institution of higher education or training institution, if the person's activities are performed under qualified supervision and are part of the person's supervised course of study.
- (6) A person who has earned an educational degree required for licensure under this act and who works under the supervision of a licensed mental health professional in order to acquire the hours necessary for licensure under this act.

- In addition to any other civil remedy or criminal penalty provided for in this act, the board, by a vote of the majority of the maximum number of the authorized membership of the board as provided by law, or by a vote of the majority of the duly qualified and confirmed membership or a minimum of three members, whichever is greater, may levy a civil
- penalty of up to \$1,000 on [any]:

- 30 (a.2) Practice of marriage and family therapy prohibited. --

- 1 It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in the practice of
- 2 <u>licensed marriage and family therapy without possessing a valid,</u>
- 3 unexpired, unrevoked and unsuspended license under this act.

- 5 Section 5. The State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and
- 6 Family Therapists and Professional Counselors shall promulgate
- 7 regulations to carry out this act. Publication of the final-form
- 8 regulations under this section shall take place within 18 months

- 10 Section 6. This act shall take effect in 120 days.
