A RESOLUTION

- 1 Establishing a select committee to investigate and make
- 2 recommendations concerning safety and security in public and
- nonpublic schools and institutions of higher education in
- 4 this Commonwealth.
- 5 WHEREAS, One of a society's most important responsibilities
- 6 is the education of its citizens; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The citizens of this Commonwealth are educated
- 8 through a system of public and nonpublic schools and
- 9 institutions of higher education; and
- 10 WHEREAS, In order for students to learn, they must be
- 11 educated in a safe and secure environment; and
- 12 WHEREAS, In 1995, the General Assembly created the Office of
- 13 Safe Schools within the Department of Education to coordinate
- 14 antiviolence efforts between schools and the community; to

- 1 collect and disseminate information and strategies to assist in
- 2 the development of programs to impact school violence; to
- 3 provide training to schools, parents, law enforcement and the
- 4 community to prevent school violence; and to conduct other
- 5 efforts aimed at promoting school safety; and
- 6 WHEREAS, In 2000, the General Assembly created the position
- 7 of safe schools advocate in school districts of the first class
- 8 to monitor the school district's compliance with the
- 9 Commonwealth's school safety laws, to receive inquiries from and
- 10 provide assistance to victims of acts of violence on school
- 11 property and to conduct other efforts aimed at promoting school
- 12 safety in school districts of the first class; and
- 13 WHEREAS, It is important to ensure that the public and
- 14 nonpublic schools and institutions of higher education in this
- 15 Commonwealth, in conjunction with State and local law
- 16 enforcement agencies, are taking reasonable actions toward
- 17 making their facilities safe and secure for students, employees
- 18 and visitors; therefore be it
- 19 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives establish a
- 20 select committee to investigate, review and make recommendations
- 21 regarding:
- 22 (1) current security policies and procedures in public
- and nonpublic schools and institutions of higher education in
- 24 this Commonwealth and ways in which school policies and
- 25 procedures could be improved;
- 26 (2) current State laws and regulations related to school
- 27 safety and security and ways in which State laws and
- regulations could be strengthened, including a review of laws
- and regulations related to school safety and security in
- 30 effect in other states;

- 1 (3) early detection of potentially violent perpetrators,
- 2 including strategies that may be used by education, health
- and other professionals to identify family, community and
- 4 environmental factors that may lead to potentially violent
- 5 behaviors; and
- 6 (4) any potential budgetary, revenue and governance
- 7 reforms necessary to address these matters;
- 8 and be it further
- 9 RESOLVED, That the Speaker of the House of Representatives
- 10 appoint, within 15 days of passage of this resolution, in
- 11 consultation with the Majority and Minority Leaders of the House
- 12 of Representatives, the following members of the House of
- 13 Representatives to the select committee, with one member from
- 14 each standing committee being appointed from the majority party
- 15 and one member from each standing committee being appointed from
- 16 the minority party:
- 17 (1) two members from the Education Committee;
- 18 (2) two members from the Health Committee;
- 19 (3) two members from the Local Government Committee;
- 20 (4) two members from the Children and Youth Committee;
- 21 (5) two members from the Judiciary Committee;
- 22 (6) two members from the Veterans Affairs and Emergency
- 23 Preparedness Committee; and
- 24 (7) one at-large member who shall act as chairperson of
- 25 the select committee;
- 26 and be it further
- 27 RESOLVED, That the select committee hold hearings, take
- 28 testimony and make its investigation at the places it deems
- 29 necessary in this Commonwealth; and be it further
- 30 RESOLVED, That the select committee be empowered to call

- 1 witnesses under the hand and seal of the chairperson and
- 2 instruct any person to appear before it to answer questions
- 3 touching matters properly being inquired into by the committee
- 4 and to produce books, papers, records, accounts, reports and
- 5 documents as the committee deems necessary; and be it further
- 6 RESOLVED, That, in addition to other witnesses the select
- 7 committee may call, the Office of Safe Schools in the Department
- 8 of Education and the safe schools advocate in school districts
- 9 of the first class cooperate with the select committee by
- 10 providing testimony and producing documents and other
- 11 information requested by the select committee; and be it further
- 12 RESOLVED, That the Speaker and the Majority Leader of the
- 13 House of Representatives provide staffing and assistance to the
- 14 select committee, including obtaining relevant data and other
- 15 research; and be it further
- 16 RESOLVED, That the ordinary and reasonable expenses incurred
- 17 by the select committee be paid from accounts under the control
- 18 of the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives; and be it
- 19 further
- 20 RESOLVED, That the select committee submit a report of its
- 21 findings together with its recommendations for any appropriate
- 22 legislation or other action to the House of Representatives not
- 23 later than September 30, 2013.
