A RESOLUTION

1 2 3 4 5	Directing the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to study the allocation of gaming revenue provided to Philadelphia from the Property Tax Relief Fund and whether wage tax relief or property tax relief best represents the needs of the residents and taxpayers of the city.
6	WHEREAS, The 2006 Taxpayer Relief Act and Title 4 of the
7	Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes created the Property Tax
8	Relief Fund as a way to use gaming revenue to reduce property
9	taxes for homeowners across the Commonwealth; and
10	WHEREAS, The only exception to the use of gaming revenue to
11	reduce property taxes is in Philadelphia, where gaming revenue
12	is used to reduce the city's wage tax; and
13	WHEREAS, At the time of passage of the Taxpayer Relief Act,
14	some believed that the taxpayers of Philadelphia would best be
15	served with a reduction in wage tax instead of a reduction in
16	property taxes; and
17	WHEREAS, A significant amount of the revenue generated by

19 nonresidents who work in the city but live in a surrounding

18 gaming for Philadelphia for wage tax relief is dedicated to

1 county; and

2 WHEREAS, Thirty-five percent of the city's allocation from 3 the Property Tax Relief Fund is provided for suburban wage tax 4 relief that does not stay within the city; and

5 WHEREAS, Some suburban county residents receive both wage and 6 property tax relief; and

7 WHEREAS, Financial analysts have said that Philadelphia
8 residents pay less in property taxes and more in wage taxes than
9 residents of many other jurisdictions; and

10 WHEREAS, The City of Philadelphia is set to implement a new, 11 updated property tax assessment plan in 2013, known as Actual 12 Value Initiative, or AVI; and

13 WHEREAS, AVI is expected to result in higher property tax 14 assessments for hundreds of thousands of city residents; and 15 WHEREAS, Many residents could see an increase in property 16 taxes as high as 300%; and

WHEREAS, Notices of the new assessments are expected to be mailed to residents in February 2013, and the new values are expected to be the basis for property tax bills due in 2014; and WHEREAS, AVI is a new proposal that was not under consideration when the Taxpayer Relief Act and Title 4 were first implemented by the General Assembly; and

23 WHEREAS, The impacts of AVI on property taxpayers in 24 Philadelphia could have dire impacts on homeowners and 25 communities across the city; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to study the allocation of gaming revenue provided to Philadelphia from the Property Tax Relief Fund; and be it further

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study whether wage tax relief or property tax relief best
 represents the needs of the residents and taxpayers of
 Philadelphia; and be it further

4 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee
5 take into account Philadelphia's plan to implement AVI and
6 reassess property values on all properties in the city; and be

8 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee 9 report all findings on this matter to the General Assembly no 10 later than six months after the adoption of this resolution.
