## A RESOLUTION

- Paying tribute to the heroic efforts and sacrifices of the United States Armed Forces during the Battle of Iwo Jima on
- its 68th anniversary.
- 4 WHEREAS, The World War II battle for the Island of Iwo Jima
- 5 was the most difficult in United States Marine Corps history;
- 6 and
- 7 WHEREAS, Understanding that the price they were expected to
- 8 pay was high, the soldiers, sailors, marines and airmen whose
- 9 mission it was to take the Island of Iwo Jima nevertheless set
- 10 to the task with extraordinary determination; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The United States Marine Corps suffered more than
- 12 23,000 casualties, including nearly 6,000 marines who lost their
- 13 lives; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The United States Marine Corps fought against an

- 1 entrenched and determined enemy force numbering approximately
- 2 20,000 soldiers and sailors; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The courageous men battled yard by yard over a 36-
- 4 day period to conquer the eight-square-mile volcanic island; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The victory achieved at Iwo Jima provided the United
- 6 States with a strategic base in the Western Pacific for the
- 7 final push against the enemy, thereby bringing the Pacific phase
- 8 of World War II one step closer to its conclusion; and
- 9 WHEREAS, When the American flag was raised over Mount
- 10 Suribachi, signifying American command over the island, the
- 11 conduct of these fighting men was such that Admiral Chester
- 12 Nimitz proclaimed that during this battle "uncommon valor was a
- 13 common virtue"; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The American victory, and the symbolic culmination
- 15 of countless acts of bravery and selfless sacrifice, was
- 16 captured for all and etched indelibly in our consciousness in
- 17 the photograph of the planting of the flag on Mount Suribachi;
- 18 and
- 19 WHEREAS, That powerful image evokes profound thoughts and
- 20 emotions for generations removed from the epic battle; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Iwo Jima has entered the history books as one of the
- 22 most courageous examples of the fighting spirit of the United
- 23 States Armed Forces; and
- 24 WHEREAS, The 68th anniversary of the Battle of Iwo Jima will
- 25 commence on February 19, 2013; therefore be it
- 26 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge all
- 27 Pennsylvanians to join their fellow Americans in paying tribute
- 28 to the courageous members of the United States Armed Forces who
- 29 were involved in the Battle of Iwo Jima and use February 19,
- 30 2013, as a time of reflection on the bravery and spirit of our
