A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing the week of May 12 through 18, 2013, as "National Police Week" and May 6, 2013, as "Police Officers' Memorial
- 3 Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 4 WHEREAS, Since the beginning of law enforcement within this
- 5 Commonwealth, approximately 774 police officers have made the
- 6 ultimate sacrifice while in the line of duty, including the
- 7 following officers who died in 2012: Trooper First Class Blake
- 8 T. Coble, Pennsylvania State Police; Police Officer Bradley M.
- 9 Fox, Plymouth Township Police Department; Patrolman Avery
- 10 Freeman, Chester Police Department; Police Officer Brian
- 11 Lorenzo, Philadelphia Police Department and Police Officer Moses
- 12 Walker, Jr., Philadelphia Police Department; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Across the United States the week of May 12 through
- 14 18, 2013, will be recognized as "National Police Week"; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The first National Police Officers' Memorial Day was

- 1 held on May 15, 1982, following a proclamation signed by
- 2 President John F. Kennedy on October 1, 1962, and has continued
- 3 to be observed annually in memory of those police officers who
- 4 made the ultimate sacrifice in the line of duty; therefore be it
- 5 RESOLVED, That the Senate honor the memory of the hundreds of
- 6 police officers who have given their lives in the line of duty
- 7 in this Commonwealth; and be it further
- 8 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 9 week of May 12 through 18, 2013, as "National Police Week" and
- 10 May 6, 2013, as "Police Officers' Memorial Day" in Pennsylvania.
