A RESOLUTION

1 2	Designating the month of September 2013 as "Emergency Preparedness Month" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, Each year, disaster strikes communities across the
4	world, causing individuals to flee their homes, often with very
5	little advance warning; and
6	WHEREAS, Thousands of Americans are displaced by disasters
7	every year, many of them elderly and infirm; and
8	WHEREAS, Each year, the President proclaims September as
9	"National Emergency Preparedness Month" to stress the importance
10	of strengthening the security and resiliency of the nation
11	through systematic preparation for the full range of hazards
12	threatening the United States in the 21st century, including
13	natural disasters, cyber attacks, pandemic disease and acts of

2 WHEREAS, Each year, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and its 3 communities participate and observe September as Emergency 4 Preparedness Month in Pennsylvania to ensure that residents and 5 the townships, boroughs, cities and counties in which they live 6 take the steps necessary to be ready for any disaster, natural 7 or manmade; and

8 WHEREAS, Each year, in communities large and small, victims of disasters and emergencies in Pennsylvania and across the 9 United States turn to neighbors, familiar and new, for help 10 through the American Red Cross, the Salvation Army, local fire 11 departments, police departments, ambulance and paramedic 12 13 services, military bases, hospitals, urban search and rescue 14 units, wilderness search and rescue groups, canine rescue units, 15 dive teams, county 911 coordinators and staff, county hazardous 16 material teams, local emergency management coordinators and staff, county emergency management coordinators and staff, 17 18 Medevac agencies, State Police troops, Civil Air Patrols, ham 19 radio operators, National Guard personnel, local fire police and 20 many other paid staff and volunteers with various governmental, nonprofit agencies and other groups; and 21

22 WHEREAS, Disasters come in many forms, from natural disasters 23 like hurricanes, tornadoes or even manmade attacks like those of 24 13 years ago that occurred on September 11, 2001; and

25 WHEREAS, The Federal Emergency Management Agency encourages 26 individuals to have emergency preparedness kits on hand should 27 disaster strike and provides information through its website, 28 www.ready.gov, to educate residents on how to prepare for 29 emergencies and disasters; and

30 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency does
