## A RESOLUTION

Recognizing ChildFirst PA for its commitment to training members <-of multidisciplinary investigative teams and nationallyrecognized child abuse forensic interview training program in-3 Pennsylvania. 5 WHEREAS, Children bring happiness into our lives and hope to-6 our future; and 7 WHEREAS, Children are our greatest resource and our most-8 important responsibility; and 9 WHEREAS, It is our responsibility as parents, friends, 10 neighbors, citizens and lawmakers to nurture and protect 11 children, providing an atmosphere of love and respect in which 12 they are able to grow into healthy, well adjusted and productive 13 adults; and 14 WHEREAS, We, as a legislative body, have an ongoing-15 commitment to protect the rights and needs of children; and 16 WHEREAS, Child abuse crosses all racial, economic and

- 1 geographic boundaries and has reached epidemic proportions-
- 2 across this nation and throughout this Commonwealth; and
- 3 WHEREAS, There were 26,664 cases of possible child abuse or
- 4 maltreatment referred for investigation in this Commonwealth in
- 5 <del>2012; and</del>
- 6 WHEREAS, There were 3,565 substantiated cases of child abuse
- 7 and neglect in this Commonwealth in 2012; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Thousands of Pennsylvanians in schools, social
- 9 service agencies, churches and neighborhood groups throughout
- 10 this Commonwealth are working hard to nurture and support the
- 11 victims of child abuse and prevent future abuse; and
- 12 WHEREAS, In spite of the dedication and sacrifice of these
- 13 individuals, much more still needs to be done to guarantee a
- 14 childhood free of abuse and victimization to every child in this-
- 15 Commonwealth; and
- 16 WHEREAS, As a legislative body, we acknowledge that each
- 17 county is required by the Child Protective Services Law to form-
- 18 and operate a multidisciplinary investigative team (MDIT); and
- 19 WHEREAS, ChildFirst is a nationally recognized forensic-
- 20 interview training program developed by the National Child-
- 21 Protection and Training Center (NCPTC) and Cornerhouse; and
- 22 WHEREAS, In July 2009, the Pennsylvania Children and Youth
- 23 Solicitors Association applied to bring ChildFirst to-
- 24 Pennsylvania; and
- 25 WHEREAS, ChildFirst PA is sponsored by the Pennsylvania
- 26 Children and Youth Solicitors Association in collaboration with
- 27 the Pennsylvania District Attorneys Association and the
- 28 Pennsylvania State Police; and
- 29 WHEREAS, In March 2011, Pennsylvania became the 17th
- 30 ChildFirst state; and

- 1 WHEREAS, On December 12, 2011, House Resolution 522 of
- 2 Session 2011 was passed, directing the formation of the
- 4 child abuse related statutes and to make recommendations on how-

Governor's Task Force on Child Protection to review the current

- 5 to improve the child abuse system; and
- 6 WHEREAS, On November 27, 2012, the Governor's Task Force on
- 7 Child Protection submitted its report of more than 400 pages to
- 8 the Governor; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The Governor's Task Force on Child Protection
- 10 acknowledged the need to have well trained forensic interviewers
- 11 who are prepared to interview a child alleged to be a victim of
- 12 abuse in an age appropriate and developmentally appropriate
- 13 manner; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The Governor's Task Force on Child Protection
- 15 acknowledges the need for fully trained and functional MDITs in-
- 16 each county across this Commonwealth; and
- 17 WHEREAS, ChildFirst PA has trained more than 28 of
- 18 Pennsylvania's 67 counties and more than 300 professionals-
- 19 charged with the responsibility of investigating suspected child-
- 20 abuse; and
- 21 WHEREAS, ChildFirst PA is anchored at the Pennsylvania State
- 22 Police Academy and training centers across this Commonwealth;
- 23 and
- 24 WHEREAS, The ChildFirst PA motto should be considered at all
- 25 times during a child abuse investigation and prosecution:
- 26 "The Child is our first priority.
- 27 It is not the needs of the family.
- Not the child's 'story.'
- Not the evidence.
- Not the needs of the courts.

- 1 Not the needs of the police, Children and Youth
- 2 Services or attorneys.
- 3 The Child is our priority."
- 5 WHEREAS, ChildFirst PA is the only nationally recognized
- 6 forensic interview and MDIT training program in this-
- 7 Commonwealth; therefore be it
- 8 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate
- 9 ChildFirst PA as a recognized forensic interview training
- 10 program and MDIT; and be it further
- 11 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives continue to do
- 12 its part in support of the training done by ChildFirst PA; and
- 13 be it further
- 14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives commend the
- 15 Pennsylvania Children and Youth Solicitors Association,
- 16 Pennsylvania District Attorneys Association, Pennsylvania State
- 17 Police, ChildFirst PA and all of its faculty who train the
- 18 forensic interviewers and professional members of the
- 19 multidisciplinary investigative teams to investigate suspected
- 20 <del>child abuse.</del>
- 21 RECOGNIZING CHILDFIRST PENNSYLVANIA FOR ITS FORENSIC INTERVIEWER <--
- 22 CHILD ABUSE TRAINING PROGRAM AND COMMITMENT TO TRAINING

- 25 WHEREAS, CHILDFIRST IS A NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED FORENSIC
- 26 INTERVIEW TRAINING PROGRAM DEVELOPED IN PARTNERSHIP BY
- 27 CORNERHOUSE, A CHILD ABUSE TRAINING FACILITY IN MINNEAPOLIS,
- 28 MINNESOTA, AND THE NATIONAL CHILD PROTECTION AND TRAINING CENTER
- 29 (NCPTC); AND
- 30 WHEREAS, THE CHILDFIRST PROGRAM'S PURPOSE SINCE 2003 HAS BEEN
- 31 TO ASSIST STATES IN DEVELOPING CERTIFIED FORENSIC INTERVIEW
- 32 TRAINING PROGRAMS IN CASES OF CHILD ABUSE AND TO ASSIST LAW

- 1 ENFORCEMENT, CHILDREN AND YOUTH SERVICES WORKERS AND OTHERS IN
- 2 INTERVIEWING THE ALLEGED VICTIMS OF CHILD ABUSE IN AN AGE AND
- 3 DEVELOPMENTALLY APPROPRIATE MANNER; AND
- 4 WHEREAS, IN JULY 2009, THE PENNSYLVANIA CHILDREN AND YOUTH
- 5 SOLICITORS ASSOCIATION FIRST APPLIED TO BRING CHILDFIRST TO
- 6 PENNSYLVANIA; AND
- 7 WHEREAS, IN MARCH 2011, PENNSYLVANIA BECAME THE 17TH STATE IN
- 8 THE NATION TO UTILIZE THE CHILDFIRST TRAINING; AND
- 9 WHEREAS, CHILDFIRST PENNSYLVANIA TRAINING HAS SINCE BEEN USED
- 10 IN MORE THAN 28 OF PENNSYLVANIA'S 67 COUNTIES, WITH MORE THAN
- 11 300 PROFESSIONALS CHARGED WITH THE RESPONSIBILITY OF
- 12 INVESTIGATING SUSPECTED CHILD ABUSE HAVING UNDERGONE THE
- 13 EXTENSIVE FIVE-DAY TRAINING COURSE, WRITTEN EXAMINATION AND
- 14 CERTIFICATION PROCESS; AND
- 15 WHEREAS, CHILDFIRST PENNSYLVANIA HAS BEEN AN INVALUABLE
- 16 TRAINING TOOL FOR THE MULTI-DISCIPLINARY INVESTIGATIVE TEAMS IN
- 17 THE COMMONWEALTH; THEREFORE BE IT
- 18 RESOLVED, THAT THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES RECOGNIZE
- 19 CHILDFIRST PENNSYLVANIA AS A RECOGNIZED RESPECTED FORENSIC
- 20 INTERVIEWER AND MULTI-DISCIPLINARY INVESTIGATIVE TEAM TRAINING
- 21 PROGRAM; AND BE IT FURTHER
- 22 RESOLVED, THAT THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES COMMEND THE
- 23 FACULTY MEMBERS WHO DELIVER THE CHILDFIRST PENNSYLVANIA TRAINING
- 24 TO THOSE WHO INVESTIGATE SUSPECTED CHILD ABUSE IN THIS
- 25 COMMONWEALTH; AND BE IT FURTHER
- 26 RESOLVED, THAT THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES COMMEND THE
- 27 PENNSYLVANIA CHILDREN AND YOUTH SOLICITORS ASSOCIATION FOR
- 28 WORKING COLLABORATIVELY WITH THE PENNSYLVANIA DISTRICT ATTORNEYS
- 29 ASSOCIATION AND THE PENNSYLVANIA STATE POLICE TO BRING THE
- 30 CHILDFIRST TRAINING PROGRAM TO THIS COMMONWEALTH.
