A RESOLUTION

- Directing the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to conduct a study on the costs and services of the county adult probation system.

 WHEREAS, County adult probation departments fill a critical need in this Commonwealth's criminal justice system; and

 WHEREAS, According to the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and

 Parole's annual statistical report released in 2012, offenders
- 8 supervised by county adult probation departments represented 86%
- 9 of the total offenders on supervision, while 13% were supervised
- 10 by the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The number of offenders supervised by county adult
- 12 probation and parole departments totaled 241,723, according to
- 13 the report released by the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and
- 14 Parole in 2012; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The number of adult offenders supervised by county
- 16 probation and parole departments increased by 4,549 offenders or
- 17 1.9% between December 2011 and December 2012, according to the
- 18 report released by the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and

- 1 Parole in 2012; and
- 2 WHEREAS, The number of county probation officers supervising
- 3 a caseload increased by 34 adult probation officers between
- 4 December 2011 and December 2012, according to the report
- 5 released by the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole in
- 6 2012; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The average caseload is 148 offenders per county
- 8 adult probation officer, according to the 2012 statistical
- 9 report of the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The General Assembly enacted legislation in 1965 to
- 11 provide a grant-in-aid program in order to support county adult
- 12 probation and parole departments; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Grant-in-aid has been provided to the 65 counties
- 14 with adult probation and parole departments since fiscal year
- 15 1966-1967; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The objectives of the grant-in-aid program are to
- 17 maintain, improve and expand county adult probation and parole
- 18 personnel and program services, provide protection to the public
- 19 through effective community correctional services and provide
- 20 training to county adult probation and parole personnel; and
- 21 WHEREAS, The House of Representatives last received a report
- 22 from the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee entitled "A
- 23 Study of Costs and Services in Pennsylvania's County Adult
- 24 Probation System" in 2000 through the adoption of House
- 25 Resolution 251; therefore be it
- 26 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the
- 27 Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to study the county
- 28 adult probation system, specifically the grant-in-aid formula,
- 29 county costs and supervision fees to determine the impact on the
- 30 quality and level of program services offered through the county

- 1 adult probation system; and be it further
- 2 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee
- 3 report its findings to the House of Representatives by November
- 4 30, 2014.
