A RESOLUTION

1 Designating March 26, 2014, as "Pike County 200th Anniversary
2 Day" in Pennsylvania.

3 WHEREAS, Pike County was organized on March 26, 1814; and

4 WHEREAS, Pike County was formerly a part of Wayne County; and

5 WHEREAS, Pike County was named after American Brigadier

6 General and explorer Zebulon Montgomery Pike; and

7 WHEREAS, Pike County boasts as balance of towns and

8 woodlands, with the natural beauty of Dingmans Falls, just a

9 short distance from the charming Victorian architecture of the

10 county seat of Milford; and

11 WHEREAS, Each year thousands of visitors journey to Pike

12 County to enjoy some of the finest hunting and fishing

13 opportunities in the northeast, to go canoeing on the Delaware

14 River or boating on Lake Wallenpaupak or simply to enjoy a hike

15 through the Delaware Water Gap National Recreation Area; and
