## A RESOLUTION

1 2 3	Urging the President and the Congress of the United States to consider the impact of free trade agreements on the American economy.
4	WHEREAS, The United States currently has many international
5	free trade agreements in place with foreign countries; and
6	WHEREAS, In addition to the free trade agreements the United
7	States has created with individual countries, the United States
8	is a partner in several multinational free trade agreements,
9	such as the recently implemented Transatlantic Trade and
10	Investment Partnership and the nearly 20 year old North American
11	Free Trade Agreement; and
12	WHEREAS, The Office of the United States Trade Representative
13	recently announced that President Obama is currently in
14	negotiations for a new international free trade agreement, known
15	as the Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP); and
16	WHEREAS, If agreed to, TPP will be among the largest free
17	trade agreements in the world, comprising the United States and
18	eleven other Pacific-bordering countries, including Australia,

Brunei, Chile, Canada, Japan, Malaysia, Mexico, New Zealand,
Peru, Singapore and Vietnam; and

3 WHEREAS, Historically, American workers, small businesses and 4 human rights activists have questioned the United States' 5 decision to engage in free trade agreements with countries whose 6 labor conditions and wage standards are less than that of the 7 United States; and

8 WHEREAS, Some of the countries engaged with the United States 9 in free trade agreements impose policies that conflict with 10 American protections on intellectual property rights, which can 11 place the future of patented American designs, ideas and 12 products at risk; and

WHEREAS, Over the years, critics have attributed the closure of thousands of American small businesses, the infringement on American intellectual property and the loss of millions of family-sustaining American jobs to international free trade agreements; and

WHEREAS, American small business owners are struggling to compete with multinational corporations who have moved manufacturing facilities out of the United States; and WHEREAS, The United States is in a fragile state of economic recovery as millions of hard-working Americans continue to search for good-paying jobs to support themselves and their families; and

25 WHEREAS, States across the nation are focusing on policies 26 that can spur economic growth, create jobs and incentivize 27 businesses to keep jobs in America; therefore be it 28 RESOLVED, That Pennsylvania House of Representatives urge the 29 President and the Congress of the United States to consider the 30 impacts of free trade agreements on the American economy prior
