A RESOLUTION

Urging the Congress of the United States to immediately extend 1 the Emergency Unemployment Compensation program, restoring 2 critical benefits to the long-term unemployed of this nation. 3 4 WHEREAS, Without congressional action, the Emergency Unemployment Compensation program expired on January 1, 2014, 5 6 resulting in the abrupt end to said benefits across every state 7 in the nation; and 8 WHEREAS, The Bureau of Labor Statistics reported as of 9 January 2014, the national unemployment rate stands at 6.6%, with the Pennsylvania rate at 6.9% as of December 2013; and 10 11 WHEREAS, The United States Department of Labor estimates that 12 more than 4 million people nationwide have been unemployed for 13 more than six months, with an average unemployment duration of 14 37.2 weeks; and WHEREAS, The Emergency Unemployment Compensation program 15

1 provided up to an additional 37 weeks in compensation after a
2 worker's Pennsylvania unemployment compensation of 27 weeks had
3 been exhausted; and

4 WHEREAS, The average length of time a Pennsylvania claimant 5 collected benefits from the Emergency Unemployment Compensation 6 program was 15 weeks; and

7 WHEREAS, The National Employment Law Project has ascertained 8 that disruption in the Emergency Unemployment Compensation 9 program will have an immediate and devastating effect on 1.3 10 million Americans, 86,900 of those from the Commonwealth of 11 Pennsylvania; and

12 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Department of Labor and Industry 13 has stated that the average weekly unemployment compensation 14 payment was \$341.74 in 2012; and

15 WHEREAS, The Economic Policy Institute in Washington, DC, 16 noted that the most recent labor market turnover report 17 reflected that there were 2.9 job seekers per job available; and 18 therefore be it

19 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 20 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania urge the Congress of the United 21 States to immediately reauthorize the Emergency Unemployment 22 Compensation program, restoring benefits to millions of long-23 term unemployed; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to the presiding officers of each house of Congress and to each member of Congress from Pennsylvania.
