A RESOLUTION

- Designating the week of October 20 through 24, 2014, as
 "Juvenile Detention Centers and Alternative Programs Week" in
 Pennsylvania.

 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania has begun to reserve the use of secure
- 5 detention for only high-risk youth offenders and is using
- 6 alternative programming for moderate-risk and low-risk offenders
- 7 in order to improve outcomes for youth and ensure protection of
- 8 the community; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania's 15 secure detention centers and the
- 10 numerous alternative programs serving all 67 counties should be
- 11 recognized for their ongoing protection of our communities and
- 12 the service to youth in their custody or care; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Secure detention facilities provide 726 beds
- 14 Statewide for approximately 15,000 admissions to juvenile
- 15 detention in this Commonwealth; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The existence of these facilities and programs

- 1 provide a key service to ensure community and individual
- 2 protection; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania's juvenile detention centers and
- 4 alternative programs, adhering to the Balanced and Restorative
- 5 Justice Model, contribute to public safety by providing a stable
- 6 environment for at-risk youth, both preadjudicated and
- 7 adjudicated, providing education and programming and ensuring
- 8 sufficient opportunities for growth and development of
- 9 Pennsylvania's youth; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Through the continuing efforts of the juvenile
- 11 courts of this Commonwealth, juvenile detention is utilized only
- 12 when lesser restrictive environments are not in the best
- 13 interest of the youth or community; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Juvenile detention centers and alternative programs
- 15 ensure every child's health and well-being by providing
- 16 competency development, self-discipline and stabilization
- 17 through comprehensive evaluations, both physical and behavioral
- 18 health, as well as community involvement; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Hundreds of men and women are dedicated to ensuring
- 20 the proper care and supervision of youth and are committed to
- 21 the protection of communities in this Commonwealth on a daily
- 22 basis; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Youth care workers in this Commonwealth's detention
- 24 facilities and alternative programs stand ready on a daily basis
- 25 to respond to youth who display an array of unresolved mental
- 26 health, behavioral, educational and emotional issues; and
- 27 WHEREAS, The Juvenile Detention Centers and Alternative
- 28 Programs Association acts as a primary resource for these
- 29 facilities offering education, representation and support for
- 30 all of the important services that juvenile detention centers

- 1 and alternative programs provide for this Commonwealth's youth
- 2 and communities; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Juvenile detention centers and alternative programs
- 4 in this Commonwealth in coordination with the Juvenile Detention
- 5 Centers and Alternative Programs Association merit one week of
- 6 recognition for their unending services aimed at protecting our
- 7 communities and assisting Pennsylvania's youth; therefore be it
- 8 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 9 week of October 20 through 24, 2014, as "Juvenile Detention
- 10 Centers and Alternative Programs Week" in Pennsylvania.
