AN ACT

1	Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled
2	"An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the
3	executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the
4	Executive Department thereof and the administrative
5	departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof,
6	including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or
7	Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or
8	authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative
9	departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and
10	duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative
11	officers, and of the several administrative departments,
12	boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the
13	Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive
14	and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of
15	certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and
16	other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards,
17	and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the
18	number and compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and
19 20	commissions shall be determined," in administrative
20	organization, further providing for advisory boards and
22	commissions; and, in powers and duties of Department of
23	Health and its departmental administrative and advisory
24	boards, establishing the Advisory Board on Acquired Brain
25	Injury.

26	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
27	hereby enacts as follows:

28 Section 1. Section 203 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, 29 No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, amended July 1 9, 2010 (P.L.348, No.50), is amended to read:

2	Section 203. Advisory Boards and CommissionsThe following
3	advisory boards and commissions are placed in and made parts of
4	the respective administrative departments, as follows:
5	In the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs,
6	State Military Reservation Commission,
7	In the Department of Environmental Protection,
8	Citizens Advisory Council;
9	In the Department of Health,
10	Advisory Health Board[;]_
11	Advisory Board on Acquired Brain Injury;
12	In the Department of Labor and Industry,
13	Advisory Council on Affairs of the Handicapped,
14	Advisory Board on Problems of Older Workers,
15	Policy, Planning and Evaluation Advisory Committee;
16	In the Department of Public Welfare,
17	State Board of Public Welfare,
18	Advisory Committee for the Blind,
19	Advisory Committee for General and Special Hospitals,
20	Advisory Committee for Children and Youth,
21	Advisory Committee for Public Assistance,
22	Advisory Committee for Mental Health and Mental
23	Retardation.
24	Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
25	Section 2126. Advisory Board on Acquired Brian Injury(a)
26	The Advisory Board on Acquired Brain Injury is established
27	within the Department of Health.
28	(b) The advisory board shall consist of twenty-five members
29	who shall be appointed by the Secretary of Health. The
30	membership of the advisory board shall include:

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1	(1) Family members of acquired brain injury survivors.	
2	(2) Individuals living with an acquired brain injury.	
3	(3) Representatives from the Department of Aging, Department	
4	of Public Welfare, Department of Labor and Industry, Insurance	
5	Department, Department of Health, Department of Corrections and	
6	Department of Education.	
7	(4) Representatives from a Statewide association that	
8	promotes the rights of persons with disabilities, a Statewide	
9	association that represents rehabilitation facilities, a	
10	Statewide association that represents persons with acquired	
11	brain injuries.	
12	(5) Community-based organizations that provide acquired	
13	brain injury services or advocacy.	
14	(c) The term of office of each member of the advisory board	
15	shall be three years from the third Tuesday of January of the	
16	year in which the member takes office or until the member's	
17	successor has been appointed.	
18	(d) Vacancies in the membership of the advisory board shall	
19	be filled for the balance of an unexpired term in the same	
20	manner as the original appointment.	
21	(e) Members of the advisory board shall serve without	
22	compensation but shall be entitled to reimbursement for travel	
23	and other actual expenses incurred in the performance of their	
24	<u>duties.</u>	
25	(f) A chairperson, vice chairperson and secretary of the	
26	advisory board shall be elected by the members of the board. The	
27	advisory board shall meet at least four times a year at such	
28	times and places as it shall determine.	
29	(g) Notwithstanding any provision of this section, a member	
30	who serves on the effective date of this section may complete	
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1	the member's term.
2	(h) The advisory board shall have the power, and its duty
3	shall be:
4	(1) To advise the Governor and the departments represented
5	on the advisory board in the determination of service and
6	support needs of individuals with an acquired brain injury and
7	the implementation of services to those individuals and their
8	<u>families.</u>
9	(2) To make recommendations regarding future activities to
10	be placed in the acquired brain injury State Action Plan with
11	the goal of improving access to services in this Commonwealth
12	through information and education.

13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
