## AN ACT

- 1 Requiring the notification of breast density to patients who 2 receive a mammogram.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Short title.
- 6 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Breast
- 7 Density Notification Act.
- 8 Section 2. Breast density notification and information
- 9 provided.
- 10 (a) Inclusion of density information. -- Each mammography
- 11 report provided to a patient by a mammography facility certified
- 12 by the United States Food and Drug Administration shall include
- 13 the patient's breast density information based on the Breast
- 14 Imaging Reporting and Data System established by the American
- 15 College of Radiology.

- 1 (b) Notice. -- The report shall also include the following
- 2 notice:
- 3 If your mammogram demonstrates you have dense breast tissue, <--
- 4 which could hide abnormalities, and you have other risk
- 5 factors for breast cancer that have been identified, you
- 6 might benefit from supplemental screening tests that may be
- 7 suggested by your referring physician. A report of your
- 8 mammography results, which contains information about your
- 9 breast density, has been sent to your referring physician's
- 10 office and you should contact him or her if you have any
- 11 questions or concerns about your breast density or this-
- 12 report.
- 13 THIS NOTICE CONTAINS THE RESULTS OF YOUR RECENT MAMMOGRAM,
- 14 INCLUDING INFORMATION ABOUT BREAST DENSITY. IF YOUR MAMMOGRAM
- 15 SHOWS THAT YOUR BREAST TISSUE IS DENSE, YOU SHOULD KNOW THAT
- DENSE BREAST TISSUE IS A COMMON FINDING AND IS NOT ABNORMAL.
- 17 STATISTICS SHOW AS MANY AS 70% OF WOMEN COULD HAVE DENSE OR
- 18 HIGHLY DENSE BREASTS. DENSE BREAST TISSUE CAN MAKE IT HARDER
- 19 TO FIND CANCER ON A MAMMOGRAM AND MAY BE ASSOCIATED WITH AN
- 20 INCREASED RISK OF CANCER. THIS INFORMATION ABOUT THE RESULT
- 21 OF YOUR MAMMOGRAM IS GIVEN TO YOU TO RAISE YOUR AWARENESS AND
- 22 TO INFORM YOUR CONVERSATIONS WITH YOUR PHYSICIAN. TOGETHER,
- 23 YOU CAN DECIDE WHICH SCREENING OPTIONS ARE RIGHT FOR YOU,
- 24 BASED ON YOUR MAMMOGRAM RESULTS, INDIVIDUAL RISK FACTORS OR
- 25 PHYSICAL EXAMINATION. A REPORT OF YOUR RESULTS WAS SENT TO
- 26 YOUR PHYSICIAN.
- 27 Section 3. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect in 90 days.
