AN ACT

1 Providing for bisphenol A-free baby and toddler products.

2 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

3 hereby enacts as follows:

4 Section 1. Short title.

5 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Bisphenol A-6 free Baby and Toddler Products Act.

7 Section 2. Bisphenol A-free baby and toddler products.

8 (a) General rule.--No person or entity may manufacture, sell 9 or distribute any product that contains bisphenol A at a level 10 above 0.1 parts per billion (ppb) if the product is designed or 11 intended primarily for use by infants or children four years of 12 age or younger.

13 (b) Alternatives.--

14 (1) Manufacturers shall use the least toxic alternative 15 when replacing bisphenol A in containers in accordance with 16 this section.

(2) Manufacturers shall not replace bisphenol A pursuant

to this section with carcinogens rated by the United States Environmental Protection Agency as A, B or C carcinogens or substances listed as known or likely carcinogens, known to be human carcinogens, likely to be human carcinogens or suggestive of being human carcinogens, as described in the "List of Chemicals Evaluated for Carcinogenic Potential."

7 (3) Manufacturers shall not replace bisphenol A under 8 this section with reproductive toxicants that cause birth 9 defects, reproductive harm or developmental harm, as 10 identified by the United States Environmental Protection 11 Agency.

Section 3. Violation of Unfair Trade Practices and ConsumerProtection Law.

A violation of section 2 constitutes unfair methods of competition and unfair or deceptive acts or practices within the meaning of section 2(4) of the act of December 17, 1968 (P.L.1224, No.387), known as the Unfair Trade Practices and Consumer Protection Law, and shall be subject to the enforcement provisions, civil penalties and private rights of action contained in that act.

21 Section 4. Effective date.

22 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
