## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 3 (Agriculture) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 2 Statutes, further providing for definitions and for
- 3 sanitation standards.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. The definition of "veterinarian-client-patient
- 7 relationship" in section 2501 of Title 3 of the Pennsylvania
- 8 Consolidated Statutes is amended and the section is amended by
- 9 adding definitions to read:
- 10 § 2501. Definitions.
- 11 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 12 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 13 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 14 \* \* \*
- 15 <u>"Interstate health certificate." A legible official document</u>
- 16 <u>that is:</u>
- 17 (1) made on a form issued by the chief livestock health
- 18 official of the state of origin or the United States

- 2 (2) prepared by an accredited veterinarian of the state
- 3 <u>of origin certifying the health of the animal described in</u>
- 4 the certificate; and
- 5 (3) validated by the chief livestock health official of
- 6 <u>the state of origin.</u>
- 7 \* \* \*
- 8 <u>"Pennsylvania health certificate." A legible official</u>
- 9 <u>document that is:</u>
- 10 (1) made on a form (AAI-13) provided by the department;
- 11 <u>and</u>
- 12 (2) prepared by an accredited Pennsylvania veterinarian
- or a representative of the department certifying the health
- of animals described in the certificate according to the
- 15 <u>health requirements established under Chapter 23 (relating to</u>
- domestic animals) and regulations promulgated under Chapter
- 17 23.
- 18 "Veterinarian-client-patient relationship." A relationship
- 19 in which[:
- 20 (1) the veterinarian has assumed the responsibility for
- 21 making veterinary medical judgments regarding the health of
- 22 the animal and the need for veterinary medical treatment; and
- 23 (2) the owner or caretaker of the animal has assumed
- 24 <u>responsibility to consult a veterinarian and has</u> agreed to
- follow the instructions of the veterinarian in relation to
- 26 zoonotic diseases and implementing best management practices
- intended to reduce and prevent diseases.

- 29 Section 2. Section 2502(a)(3) of Title 3 is amended to read:
- 30 § 2502. Sanitation standards.

1 (a) Minimum. -- The following sanitation standards are

2 required to minimize the risk of contracting a zoonotic disease

3 at an animal exhibition:

5 (3) A person may not bring an animal to an animal
6 exhibition unless the person [has an established
7 veterinarian-client-patient relationship.] provides the

8 <u>operator with one of the following:</u>

- (i) Except as provided under subparagraph (ii), a valid Pennsylvania health certificate or interstate health certificate.
- (ii) A signed statement by the person attesting that

  a veterinarian-client-patient relationship exists with

  regard to each animal to be exhibited, if a Pennsylvania

  or interstate health certificate is not specifically

  required under Chapter 23 (relating to domestic animals)

  and regulations promulgated under Chapter 23.
