A JOINT RESOLUTION

1 2	Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, further providing for sessions.
3	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
4	hereby resolves as follows:
5	Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of
6	Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with Article XI:
7	That section 4 of Article II be amended to read:
8	§ 4. Sessions.
9	[The] (a) Except as provided under subsection (b), the
10	General Assembly shall be a continuing body during the term for
11	which its Representatives are elected. It shall meet at 12
12	o'clock noon on the first Tuesday of January each year. Special
13	sessions shall be called by the Governor on petition of a
14	majority of the members elected to each House or may be called
15	by the Governor whenever in his opinion the public interest
16	requires.
17	(b) Unless meeting in special session, the General Assembly

may not convene a voting session from the first Tuesday after
the first Monday in November through the end of the session in

3 <u>any even-numbered year.</u>

Section 2. (a) Upon the first passage by the General 4 Assembly of this proposed constitutional amendment, the 5 Secretary of the Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to 6 7 comply with the advertising requirements of section 1 of Article 8 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the required advertisements to two newspapers in every county in 9 10 which such newspapers are published in sufficient time after 11 passage of this proposed constitutional amendment.

12 Upon the second passage by the General Assembly of this (b) 13 proposed constitutional amendment, the Secretary of the 14 Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to comply with the advertising requirements of section 1 of Article XI of the 15 16 Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the required 17 advertisements to two newspapers in every county in which such 18 newspapers are published in sufficient time after passage of 19 this proposed constitutional amendment. The Secretary of the 20 Commonwealth shall submit this proposed constitutional amendment to the qualified electors of this Commonwealth at the first 21 22 primary, general or municipal election which meets the 23 requirements of and is in conformance with section 1 of Article 24 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and which occurs at least 25 three months after the proposed constitutional amendment is 26 passed by the General Assembly.

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
