AN ACT

- Amending the act of December 5, 1936 (2nd Sp.Sess., 1937 P.L.2897, No.1), entitled "An act establishing a system of 2 unemployment compensation to be administered by the 3 Department of Labor and Industry and its existing and newly 4 created agencies with personnel (with certain exceptions) selected on a civil service basis; requiring employers to 6 keep records and make reports, and certain employers to pay 7 contributions based on payrolls to provide moneys for the 8 payment of compensation to certain unemployed persons; 9 providing procedure and administrative details for the 10 determination, payment and collection of such contributions 11 and the payment of such compensation; providing for 12 cooperation with the Federal Government and its agencies; 13 creating certain special funds in the custody of the State 14 Treasurer; and prescribing penalties," further providing for 15 qualifications required to secure compensation and for rate 17 and amount of compensation. 18 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 19 hereby enacts as follows: 20 Section 1. Sections 401(a) and (f) and 404(a)(3) of the act of December 5, 1936 (2nd Sp.Sess., 1937 P.L.2897, No.1), known 21 22 as the Unemployment Compensation Law, amended June 12, 2012 23 (P.L.577, No.60), are amended to read: 24 Section 401. Qualifications Required to Secure
- 25 Compensation. -- Compensation shall be payable to any employe who

- 1 is or becomes unemployed, and who--
- 2 (a) [Satisfies both of the following requirements:
- 3 (1)] Has, within his base year, been paid wages for
- 4 employment as required by section 404(c) of this act[.
- 5 (2) Except as provided in section 404(a)(3),]: Provided,
- 6 However, That not less than [forty-nine and one-half per centum
- 7 (49.5%)] twenty per centum (20%) of the employe's total base
- 8 year wages have been paid in one or more quarters, other than
- 9 the highest quarter in such employe's base year.
- 10 * * *
- 11 (f) Has earned, subsequent to his separation from work under
- 12 circumstances which are disqualifying under the provisions of
- 13 subsections 402(b), 402(e), 402(e.1) and 402(h) of this act,
- 14 remuneration for services in an amount equal to or in excess of
- 15 six (6) times his weekly benefit rate <u>irrespective</u> of whether or
- 16 <u>not such services were</u> in "employment" as defined in this act.
- 17 The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to a
- 18 suspension of work by an individual pursuant to a leave of
- 19 absence granted by his last employer, provided such individual
- 20 has made a reasonable effort to return to work with such
- 21 employer upon the expiration of his leave of absence.
- 22 * * *
- 23 Section 404. Rate and Amount of Compensation. -- Compensation
- 24 shall be paid to each eligible employe in accordance with the
- 25 following provisions of this section except that compensation
- 26 payable with respect to weeks ending in benefit years which
- 27 begin prior to the first day of January 1989 shall be paid on
- 28 the basis of the provisions of this section in effect at the
- 29 beginning of such benefit years.
- 30 (a) * * *

- 1 (3) If [an employe's] the base year wages of an employe
- 2 whose weekly benefit rate [as] has been determined under clause
- 3 (1) of paragraph (1) of this subsection, or redetermined under
- 4 paragraph (2) of this subsection, as the case may be, [is less
- 5 than the maximum weekly benefit rate and the employe's base year
- 6 wages] are insufficient to qualify him under subsection (c) of
- 7 this section but are sufficient to qualify him for any one of
- 8 the next [two] <u>three</u> lower weekly benefit rates, his weekly
- 9 benefit rate shall be redetermined at the highest of such next
- 10 lower rates.

- 12 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
