AN ACT

Reorganizing the Board of Trustees of The Pennsylvania State University.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows:
Section 1. Short title.
This act shall be known and may be cited as The Pennsylvania State University Board of Trustees Reorganization Act.

Section 2. Definitions.
The following words and phrases when used in this act shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
"Board." The Board of Trustees of The Pennsylvania State University.
"Term of office." The term of years for which the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Auditor General or State Treasurer is elected, or for which the president of the
university is appointed, irrespective of whether the individual completes the term.
"University." The Pennsylvania State University established under the act of February 22, 1855 (P.L.46, No.50), entitled "An act to incorporate the Farmers' High School of Pennsylvania." Section 3. Composition of board.
(a) Voting members.--Beginning January 1, 2015, the board shall consist of 23 voting members as follows:
(1) Eight members who are alumni of the university and elected by the alumni of the university in accordance with the university charter.
(2) Five members appointed by the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of a majority of all members of the Senate.
(3) Five members representing the Commonwealth's agriculture industry elected in accordance with the university charter.
(4) Five members representing business and industry endeavors appointed by the board and selected in accordance with section 4 .
(b) Ex officio members.--Beginning on the effective date of this section, the Secretary of Agriculture and the Secretary of Education, or their designees, shall serve on the board as nonvoting, ex officio members of the board. The designee shall be a deputy secretary or an equivalent position within the agency.
(c) Changes to board composition.--The General Assembly shall have the sole and exclusive authority to determine the composition of the board. Any changes to the composition of the board may only be done through a duly enacted law of this

Commonwealth. Nothing in this act shall be construed to authorize a change to the composition of the board through amendment to the university charter, constitution or bylaws or through court order or decree.

Section 4. Selection committee.
The board shall establish a five-member selection committee to review and recommend to the full board individuals to be appointed to the board pursuant to section $3(a)(4)$. The committee shall be comprised of:
(1) The chairman of the board.
(2) One member elected to the board pursuant to section $3(a)(1)$, selected by all members of the board elected pursuant to section 3(a)(1).
(3) One member appointed to the board pursuant to section $3(a)(2)$, selected by all members of the board appointed pursuant to section 3 (a) (2).
(4) One member elected to the board pursuant to section $3(a)(3)$, selected by all members of the board elected pursuant to section 3(a)(3).
(5) One member selected to the board pursuant to section 3 (a) (4).

Section 5. Term of office.
The following shall apply:
(1) The term of office of a member elected pursuant to section $3(a)(1),(3)$ or (4) shall be three years.
(2) The term of office of a member appointed by the Governor pursuant to section 3(a)(2) shall be three years and until a successor is appointed and qualified. A member may continue to hold office for a period not to exceed six months beyond the expiration of that member's term if a successor to
that member has not been duly appointed and qualified according to law.

Section 6. Vacancy.
(a) Gubernatorial appointments.--An appointment to fill a vacancy in the office of a member appointed by the Governor pursuant to section $3(\mathrm{a})(2)$ shall be made within 60 days of the vacancy and shall be for the remainder of the unexpired term.
(b) Other vacancies.--A vacancy created in any office of a member serving on the board pursuant to section 3(a)(1), (3) or (4) shall be filled in the same manner as the original position and in accordance with the university charter.

Section 7. Prohibitions.
(a) Public officials.--Beginning on the effective date of this act, the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Auditor General and State Treasurer shall be prohibited from serving on the board during their terms of office.
(b) University president.--Beginning on the effective date of this act, the president of the university shall be prohibited from serving on the board during the president's term of office. Section 8. Status of board members.

The following shall apply to board members serving on the effective date of this act:
(1) The Governor, the Secretary of the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources and the president of the university shall automatically be removed from the board on the effective date of this act.
(2) Board members appointed by the Governor may, at the discretion of the Governor, continue to hold office as members of the board for the term for which they were appointed and, notwithstanding section 5(2), until their
successors are appointed and qualified.
(3) Board members representing the interests of business and industry shall continue to hold office as members of the board for the term for which they were elected.
(4) Board members representing the interests of agriculture shall continue to hold office as members of the board for the term for which they were elected.
(5) Board members representing the interests of alumni shall continue to hold office as members of the board for the term for which they were elected.

Section 9. 2014 appointments and elections.
Notwithstanding any other provision of law or any provision of the university charter, constitution or bylaws to the contrary, the following shall apply to elections or appointments to the board in 2014:
(1) Two members shall be elected by the alumni.
(2) One member shall be elected by delegates representing county agriculture societies.
(3) One member shall be selected pursuant to section 4.
(4) One member shall be appointed by the Governor in accordance with law.

Section 10. Repeals.
All other acts or parts of acts are repealed insofar as they are inconsistent with this act.

Section 11. Effective date.
This act shall take effect immediately.
