## AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 1 act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," providing for basic education funding 5 commission. 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 8 hereby enacts as follows: 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a 10 section to read: 11 12 Section 123. Basic Education Funding Commission. -- (a) There 13 is hereby established a Basic Education Funding Commission.
- (b) The commission shall review and make recommendations
- 15 related to basic education funding as provided in this section.
- 16 (c) (1) The commission shall consist of the following
- 17 members:
- 18 <u>(i) The chair and minority chair of the Education Committee</u>
- 19 of the Senate and the chair and minority chair of the Education

- 1 Committee of the House of Representatives or their designees.
- 2 (ii) Two (2) legislators from each of the four (4)
- 3 legislative caucuses, to be appointed by the President pro
- 4 tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of
- 5 Representatives, in consultation with the Majority Leader and
- 6 Minority Leader of the Senate and the Majority Leader and
- 7 Minority Leader of the House of Representatives.
- 8 <u>(iii) The Secretary of Education or a designee.</u>
- 9 (iv) The Deputy Secretary for Elementary and Secondary
- 10 Education or a designee.
- 11 (v) An individual appointed by the Governor from within the
- 12 Governor's Administration.
- 13 (2) The commission shall appoint a member to serve as chair
- 14 of the commission.
- 15 (d) The commission shall hold its first meeting within
- 16 forty-five (45) days of the effective date of this section,
- 17 regardless of whether the Governor or all legislative caucuses
- 18 have actually approved members to the commission.
- (e) The commission shall hold meetings at the call of the
- 20 chair.
- 21 (f) The members may not receive compensation for their
- 22 services, but shall be reimbursed for all necessary travel and
- 23 other reasonable expenses incurred in connection with the
- 24 performance of their duties as members of the commission.
- 25 (g) The General Assembly shall provide administrative
- 26 support, meeting space and any other assistance required by the
- 27 commission to carry out its duties under this section in
- 28 <u>cooperation with the department. The department shall provide</u>
- 29 the commission with data, research and other information upon
- 30 request by the commission.

- 1 (h) The commission shall develop a basic education funding
- 2 <u>formula and identify factors that may be used to determine the</u>
- 3 <u>distribution of basic education funding among the school</u>
- 4 <u>districts in this Commonwealth. The factors identified under</u>
- 5 this subsection may include all of the following:
- 6 (1) The market value/personal income aid ratio averaged for
- 7 <u>each of the three (3) most recent years for each school</u>
- 8 district.
- 9 (2) The equalized millage rate averaged for each of the
- 10 three (3) most recent years for each school district.
- 11 (3) Geographic price differences identified for each school
- 12 district.
- 13 (4) Whether a school district has experienced exceptionally
- 14 high enrollment growth.
- 15 (5) Whether a school district has an exceptionally high
- 16 <u>level of local support.</u>
- 17 (6) Whether a school district has a high level of its
- 18 students in poverty as identified as eligible for free or
- 19 reduced price meals under the National School Lunch Program.
- 20 (7) Whether a school district has students identified as
- 21 limited English proficient.
- 22 (8) Whether the district has a scarce or dense population in
- 23 relation to the district size.
- 24 (9) Other factors related to the distribution of basic
- 25 education funding.
- 26 (i) The commission shall have all of the following powers
- 27 and duties:
- 28 (1) Review and make findings and recommendations related to
- 29 basic education funding in this Commonwealth.
- 30 (2) Consult with and utilize experts to assist the

- 1 commission in carrying out the duties under this subsection.
- 2 (3) Receive input from interested parties, including, but
- 3 not limited to, school districts and charter and cyber charter
- 4 <u>school operators.</u>
- 5 (4) Hold public hearings in different regions of this
- 6 <u>Commonwealth</u>.
- 7 (5) Review and consider basic education funding formulas and
- 8 factors utilized throughout the United States.
- 9 (6) In identifying the basic education funding factors under
- 10 subsection (h) and in completing the report required under this
- 11 <u>subsection</u>, <u>consider the impact these factors may have on the</u>
- 12 <u>distribution of basic education funding among the school</u>
- 13 <u>districts.</u>
- 14 (7) Review the administration of State and regional basic
- 15 education programs and services to determine if cost savings may
- 16 be achieved and make recommendations to implement the savings.
- 17 (8) Prior to recommending a basic education funding formula
- 18 under this section, consider the potential consequences of a
- 19 basic education funding formula that does not allocate to each
- 20 <u>school district at least the same level or proportion of State</u>
- 21 basic education funding as the school district received in the
- 22 prior school year.
- 23 (9) Prior to recommending a basic education funding formula
- 24 under this section, consider nationally accepted accounting and
- 25 budgeting standards.
- 26 (10) Develop a proposed basic education funding formula and
- 27 factors pursuant to subsection (h).
- 28 (11) Draft proposed regulations and proposed legislation
- 29 based on the commission's findings.
- 30 (12) Issue a report of the commission's findings and

- 1 recommendations to the Governor, the President pro tempore of
- 2 the Senate, the Majority Leader and Minority Leader of the
- 3 Senate, the Education Committee of the Senate, the Speaker of
- 4 the House of Representatives, the Majority Leader and Minority
- 5 <u>Leader of the House of Representatives</u>, the Education Committee
- 6 of the House of Representatives, the Secretary of Education and
- 7 the State Board of Education not later than one year after the
- 8 <u>effective date of this section.</u>
- 9 (j) The basic education formula developed by the commission
- 10 shall not go into effect unless the formula is approved by an
- 11 act of the General Assembly enacted after the effective date of
- 12 this section.
- (k) Every five (5) years the commission shall be
- 14 reconstituted in accordance with subsection (c) and shall meet
- 15 and hold public hearings to review the operation of the basic
- 16 education funding provisions of this section, shall make a
- 17 further report and shall issue the report to the recipients
- 18 listed in subsection (i) (11).
- (1) The General Assembly shall, through the annual
- 20 appropriations process, determine the level of State funding for
- 21 basic education.
- 22 (m) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 23 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless
- 24 the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 25 "Commission." The Basic Education Funding Commission
- 26 established under this section.
- 27 <u>"Department." The Department of Education of the</u>
- 28 Commonwealth.
- 29 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
