1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8	Amending Title 62 (Procurement) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in procurement of construction and design professional services, further providing for procurement of design professional services; and, in small and disadvantaged businesses, further providing for policy, for definitions, for duties of department, for bonding and progress payments and for report to General Assembly; and providing for small business reserve program.

11	Section 1. Section 905(b), (d) and (f) introductory
12	paragraph of Title 62 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes
13	are amended and the section is amended by adding a subsection to

15	§ 905. Procurement of design professional services.
16	* * *
17	(b) PolicyIt is the policy of this Commonwealth to
18	publicly announce all requirements for design professional
19	services and to award contracts for design professional services
20	on the basis of demonstrated competence and qualification for

1 the types of services required. There shall be a committee to 2 review the qualifications, experience and work of design 3 professionals seeking contracts with purchasing agencies. <u>The</u> 4 <u>Secretary of General Services or his designee shall review the</u> 5 <u>qualifications, experience and work of small design businesses</u> 6 <u>for small business projects.</u>

8 (c.1) Selection process for department's small business reserve program.--Where the department is authorized by law to 9 10 act as purchasing agency for design professional services for 11 the small business reserve program as referenced in section 2109 12 (relating to small business reserve program), the Secretary of 13 General Services or his designee shall select small design 14 businesses for each small business project from the list of department-verified small design businesses utilizing the 15 factors specified in subsection (e) (2) (i), (ii), (iii), (iv) and 16

17 <u>(v)</u>.

18 (d) Selection committee for all other Commonwealth 19 agencies.--Except as provided for in [subsection (c)] 20 subsections (c) and (c.1), all purchasing agencies shall use the 21 selection committee appointed by the Governor which shall be 22 composed of five members, none of whom shall be employees of the 23 Commonwealth or hold any elective office or office in any 24 political party. The members shall be architects, engineers or 25 other persons knowledgeable in construction. The members shall 26 serve for terms of two years and shall not be removed except for cause. Of the original members, three shall serve for terms of 27 28 two years and two for terms of one year. Thereafter, all terms 29 shall be for two years. Each member shall be reimbursed for 30 reasonable travel and other expenses incurred incident to

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attendance at meetings and to assigned duties and also a per 1 2 diem allowance in accordance with Commonwealth travel policies. * * * 3 (f) Design professionals.--Except as provided for in 4 [subsection (q)] subsections (c.1) and (q), the head of the 5 purchasing agency shall select design professionals as follows: 6 * * * 7 8 Section 2. The policy of this Commonwealth is to assist small and 15 16 [disadvantaged] diverse businesses in learning how to do business with Commonwealth agencies. The department shall 17 18 implement this policy in accordance with regulations promulgated by the department. 19 20 § 2102. Definitions. 21 Subject to section 2103 (relating to regulations), the following words and phrases when used in this chapter shall have 22 23 the meanings given to them in this section unless the context 24 clearly indicates otherwise: 25 ["Disadvantaged business." A small business which is owned 26 or controlled by a majority of persons, not limited to members of minority groups, who have been deprived of the opportunity to 27 28 develop and maintain a competitive position in the economy 29 because of social disadvantages.] "Diverse business." A small, department-verified business, 30

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1	including, but not limited to, service-disabled veteran-owned
2	business, veteran-owned business, woman-owned business or
3	minority-owned business.
4	<u>"Service-disabled." As defined in 51 Pa.C.S. § 9601</u>
5	(relating to definitions).
6	"Service-disabled veteran-owned small business." As defined
7	<u>in 51 Pa.C.S. § 9601.</u>
8	"Small business." A business in the United States which is
9	independently owned, is not dominant in its field of operation
10	and employs 100 or fewer employees.
11	<u>"Veteran." As defined in 51 Pa.C.S. § 9601.</u>
12	<u>"Veteran-owned small business." As defined in 51 Pa.C.S. §</u>

14	§ 2104. Duties of department.
15	The department shall have the following duties:
16	(1) Where feasible, provide appropriate staff who shall
17	be responsible to the department and who shall serve within
18	designated Commonwealth agencies to assist small and
19	[disadvantaged] <u>diverse</u> businesses in this Commonwealth in
20	learning how to do business with Commonwealth agencies.
21	(2) Give special publicity to procurement procedures and
22	issue special publications designed to assist small and
23	[disadvantaged] <u>diverse</u> businesses in learning how to do
24	business with Commonwealth agencies.
25	(3) Compile, maintain and make available source lists of
26	small and [disadvantaged] <u>diverse</u> businesses for the purpose
27	of encouraging procurement from small and disadvantaged
	businesses.

28 29	(4) Include small and [disadvantaged] <u>diverse</u> businesses

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(5) Assure that small and [disadvantaged] <u>diverse</u>
 businesses are solicited on each procurement for which the
 businesses may be suited.

4 (6) Develop special training programs to assist small
5 and [disadvantaged] <u>diverse</u> businesses in learning how to do
6 business with Commonwealth agencies.

7 (7) Assure that participation by diverse businesses is,
8 if appropriate, factored into the evaluation of proposals for
9 supplies, services or construction when a purchasing agency
10 uses the competitive sealed proposals method under section
11 513 (relating to competitive sealed proposals).

12 (8) Verify the current certification of businesses
13 seeking verification as diverse businesses.

14 § 2105. Bonding and progress payments.

15 Bonding.--Notwithstanding other provisions of this part, (a) 16 a purchasing agency may reduce the level or change the types of bonding normally required or accept alternative forms of 17 18 security to the extent reasonably necessary to encourage 19 procurement from small and [disadvantaged] diverse businesses. 20 Progress payments. -- A purchasing agency may make special (b) provisions for progress payments as it deems reasonably 21 22 necessary to encourage procurement from small and

23 [disadvantaged] <u>diverse</u> businesses.

24 (c) Exemption.--For contracts under \$25,000, small and 25 diverse businesses shall be exempt form bonding requirements 26 under this part.

27 § 2107. Report to General Assembly.

The department shall annually, before October 1, report in writing to the General Assembly [concerning the awarding of contracts to small and disadvantaged businesses during the

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preceding fiscal year] on the actual utilization of small and 1 diverse businesses as contractors and subcontractors. The report 2 shall include a list of all small and [disadvantaged] diverse 3 businesses that participated as contractors, subcontractors or 4 suppliers during the preceding fiscal year [for contracts if the 5 number of contractors under a previously existing contract for 6 7 the same supply or service is reduced to a single contractor or 8 reduced by more than 50% of the number existing on September 30, 2003. In preparing the report, the department shall verify 9 10 whether commitments made to small and disadvantaged businesses in the course of awarding these contracts have been maintained]. 11 12 Section 4. Title 62 is amended by adding a section to read: 13 § 2109. Small business reserve program. 14 The department shall establish a small business reserve program for the purpose of increasing economic opportunities for 15 small businesses and affording small businesses, including small 16 17 and diverse businesses, veteran-owned businesses and service-18 disabled veteran-owned businesses, the opportunity to bid on_ 19 Commonwealth agency contracts without competing with larger 20 businesses.

21 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
