A RESOLUTION

- Directing the Joint State Government Commission to establish an advisory committee to conduct a study on the inefficiencies
- of the criminal justice system in this Commonwealth.
- 4 WHEREAS, The United States has one of the highest
- 5 incarceration rates of all industrialized nations in the world;
- 6 and
- 7 WHEREAS, Between 1980 and 2012, the population of
- 8 incarcerated offenders in this Commonwealth increased; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The number of offenders in this Commonwealth under
- 10 the supervision of a State or county entity has also increased
- 11 during the same period; and
- 12 WHEREAS, During this period, significant resources were
- 13 utilized for the enactment, implementation and enforcement of
- 14 mandatory minimum sentences for a variety of criminal offenses;
- 15 and
- 16 WHEREAS, The General Assembly has recently taken significant
- 17 steps to address the issues of prison overcrowding, high
- 18 incarceration rates and the financial strain resulting from

- 1 those issues by enacting proactive legislation; and
- 2 WHEREAS, It is important for the General Assembly to continue
- 3 to review and propose improvements to the criminal justice
- 4 system that will provide for public safety, victim services,
- 5 reductions in recidivism, successful re-entry into society by
- 6 offenders and responsible spending by the Commonwealth and its
- 7 political subdivisions; therefore be it
- 8 RESOLVED, That the Senate direct the Joint State Government
- 9 Commission to establish an advisory committee of approximately
- 10 30 members consisting of public officials and experts to conduct
- 11 a balanced report, encompassing a wide range of backgrounds and
- 12 viewpoints, on all of the following issues:
- 13 (1) Criminal prosecutions and defense.
- 14 (2) Judicial administration and sentencing.
- 15 (3) Offender supervision and offender reentry.
- 16 (4) Victim services;
- 17 and be it further
- 18 RESOLVED, That the advisory committee conduct a report with a
- 19 thorough and comprehensive analysis of the following:
- 20 (1) Alternatives to the prosecution and incarceration of
- 21 low-level, nonviolent crimes.
- 22 (2) Enhancing re-entry programs that result in the
- reintegration of offenders into society and result in reduced
- 24 recidivism.
- 25 (3) Achieving uniformity in criminal charging,
- 26 prosecution and sentencing to avoid and eliminate disparities
- between jurisdictions in this Commonwealth.
- 28 (4) Sentencing reform to eliminate unnecessary mandatory
- 29 minimum sentences that prohibit or prevent the use of
- 30 alternative sentencing or rehabilitation strategies.

- 1 (5) Prioritizing prosecutions by State and local
 2 officials to focus on the most serious crimes, such as
 3 violent crimes.
 - (6) Directing resources from all levels of law enforcement that enhance community-oriented policing to assist vulnerable populations and victim input, including coordinating with public, private and parochial schools.
 - (7) Proposed reforms of the criminal justice system made to the House Judiciary Committee and Senate Judiciary Committee, recent State laws pertaining to the criminal justice system and sentencing guidelines as adopted by the Pennsylvania Commission on Sentencing.
- 13 (8) Proposed reforms and best practices from other
 14 states regarding the inefficiencies of the criminal justice
 15 system;
- 16 and be it further

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- 17 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission
- 18 establish a process by which interested members of the public
- 19 can make suggestions and have input; and be it further
- 20 RESOLVED, That the report include any recommendations to
- 21 propose or amend any law, regulation or policy to reduce
- 22 reliance on mandatory minimum sentences, address recidivism and
- 23 promote rehabilitation and successful re-entry in a cost-
- 24 effective manner; and be it further
- 25 RESOLVED, That the report of the Joint State Government
- 26 Commission be sent to the Judiciary Committee and the Public
- 27 Heath and Welfare Committee of the Senate no later than December
- 28 31, 2014.
