## A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Calling for an amendment to the Constitution of the United 1 States in accordance with Article V to reduce the powers of 2 the Federal bureaucracy by eliminating the Federal Department 3 of Education, the Federal Department of Energy, the Federal 4 Reserve System, the Federal Home Loan Mortgage Corporation 5 (Freddie Mac) and the Federal National Mortgage Association 6 (Fannie Mae). 7 8 WHEREAS, The Constitution of the United States implies 9 inherent powers of the President of the United States, through Article II: "the executive Power shall be vested in a President" 10 and the President should take care that the laws be faithfully 11 12 executed, however, this article does not cite the power to 13 create a bureaucratic department or agency that could be 14 addressed by the states; and 15 WHEREAS, The Constitution of the United States does not 16 expressly give the executive branch of the Federal Government 17 the power to create the Federal Department of Education, the 18 Federal Department of Energy, the Federal Reserve System, 19 Freddie Mac or Fannie Mae; and 20 WHEREAS, The elimination of the Federal Department of 21 Education would allow each independent and sovereign state to

1 define public education for themselves; and

2 WHEREAS, The elimination of the Federal Department of Energy 3 would increase the sovereignty of the states by allowing them to establish their own energy policies through state standards and 4 not ones mandated and enforced by the Federal Government; and 5 6 WHEREAS, The elimination of the Federal Reserve System would allow the free market to operate, increasing the value of the 7 8 United States dollar by placing it back on the gold standard 9 backed up with gold as opposed to the Federal Government's 10 dollar, which has increased our national debt by trillions of dollars; and 11

12 WHEREAS, Freddie Mac represents a government agency neither 13 the Congress nor the President had the power to create and one 14 that has failed to protect the interests of the American people, 15 while burdening future generations with debt; and 16 WHEREAS, The elimination of Fannie Mae would rightly concede this function to the states as envisioned by the 10th amendment 17 18 to the Constitution of the United States, "The powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution, nor 19 20 prohibited by it to the States, are reserved to the States respectively, or to the people"; therefore be it 21 22 RESOLVED, (the House of Representatives concurring), That the 23 General Assembly, in accordance with Article V of the 24 Constitution of the United States, call for an amendment to limit or otherwise reduce the Federal bureaucracy by eliminating 25 the Federal Department of Education, the Federal Department of 26 27 Energy, the Federal Reserve System, Freddie Mac and Fannie Mae; 28 be it further
