A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of February 2014 as "Turner Syndrome Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Turner Syndrome is a noninheritable chromosomal
- 4 disorder that affects one in 2,500 live female births; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Earlier diagnosis will help the girls and women get
- 6 a complete cardiac screening; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Risk for acute aortic dissection is increased by
- 8 more than a hundredfold in young and middle-aged women with
- 9 Turner Syndrome; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Early diagnosis facilitates prevention or
- 11 remediation of growth failure, hearing problems and learning
- 12 difficulties; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Individuals with Turner Syndrome have an increased
- 14 risk of a nonverbal learning disorder that can cause problems in
- 15 math, visual-spatial skills, executive-function skills and job
- 16 retention; and
- 17 WHEREAS, A disproportionately small amount of funding is

- 1 available for Turner Syndrome research and support; and
- 2 WHEREAS, With the help of medical specialists and a good
- 3 social support system, a woman with Turner Syndrome can live a
- 4 happy and healthy life; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The establishment of Turner Syndrome Awareness Month
- 6 will provide the opportunity to share experience and information
- 7 and raise public awareness about Turner Syndrome; therefore be
- 8 it

- 10 2014 as "Turner Syndrome Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
