## AN ACT

- Designating the "shelter pet" as the official pet of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
- 3 The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
- WHEREAS, Approximately 62% of all households in the United
- 5 States have a pet; and
- 6 WHEREAS, About 83.3 million dogs and about 95.6 million cats
- 7 are owned in the United States; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The growing pet population continues to be a problem
- 9 in this Commonwealth and across the nation, placing an
- 10 increasing strain on local animal shelters; and
- 11 WHEREAS, There are an estimated 3,500 animal shelters across
- 12 the United States; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Approximately six million to eight million companion
- 14 animals enter animal shelters nationwide every year; and
- WHEREAS, An estimated 2.7 million healthy, adoptable cats and
- 16 dogs are euthanized by shelters each year; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Nearly 750,000 dogs and cats classified as

- 1 unadoptable are euthanized annually for reasons such as illness,
- 2 aggression and owner request; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Nationally, 20% of owned dogs and 26% of owned cats
- 4 are adopted from an animal shelter; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Twenty-five percent of dogs who enter local shelters
- 6 are purebred; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Most shelters perform health examinations and give
- 8 vaccinations to animals when they arrive, and most spay or
- 9 neuter them before being adopted; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Adopting a pet from an animal shelter is less
- 11 expensive than buying a pet at a pet store or through a breeder;
- 12 and
- 13 WHEREAS, The number of euthanized animals could be reduced
- 14 dramatically if more people adopted pets instead of buying them.
- 15 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 16 hereby enacts as follows:
- 17 Section 1. Official State Pet.
- 18 The "shelter pet" is hereby designated as the official pet of
- 19 the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
- 20 Section 2. Effective date.
- 21 This act shall take effect immediately.
