## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10	Amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), entitled "An act concerning elections, including general, municipal, special and primary elections, the nomination of candidates, primary and election expenses and election contests; creating and defining membership of county boards of elections; imposing duties upon the Secretary of the Commonwealth, courts, county boards of elections, county commissioners; imposing penalties for violation of the act, and codifying, revising and consolidating the laws relating thereto; and repealing certain acts and parts of acts relating to
11 12	elections," in district election officers, further providing for appointment of watchers.
13	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
14	hereby enacts as follows:
15	Section 1. Section 417(b) of the act of June 3, 1937
16	(P.L.1333, No.320), known as the Pennsylvania Election Code,
17	amended October 8, 2004 (P.L.807, No.97), is amended to read:
18	Section 417. Appointment of Watchers
19	* * *
20	(b) Each watcher so appointed must be a qualified registered
21	elector of [the county in which the election district for which
22	the watcher was appointed is located] this Commonwealth. Each

watcher so appointed shall be authorized to serve in the 1 2 election district for which the watcher was appointed and, when 3 the watcher is not serving in the election district for which the watcher was appointed, in any other election district [in 4 5 the county in which the watcher is a qualified registered elector] located in the same county as the election district to\_ 6 7 which the watcher is appointed: Provided, That only one watcher 8 for each candidate at primaries, or for each party or political 9 body at general, municipal or special elections, shall be 10 present in the polling place at any one time from the time that the election officers meet prior to the opening of the polls 11 12 under section 1208 until the time that the counting of votes is 13 complete and the district register and voting check list is 14 locked and sealed, and all watchers in the room shall remain 15 outside the enclosed space. It shall not be a requirement that a 16 watcher be a resident of the election district for which the watcher is appointed. After the close of the polls and while the 17 18 ballots are being counted or voting machine canvassed, all the 19 watchers shall be permitted to be in the polling place outside 20 the enclosed space. Each watcher shall be provided with a certificate from the county board of elections, stating his name 21 and the name of the candidate, party or political body he 22 23 represents. Watchers shall be required to show their 24 certificates when requested to do so. Watchers allowed in the 25 polling place under the provisions of this act, shall be 26 permitted to keep a list of voters and shall be entitled to 27 challenge any person making application to vote and to require 28 proof of his qualifications, as provided by this act. During 29 those intervals when voters are not present in the polling place either voting or waiting to vote, the judge of elections shall 30

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1 permit watchers, upon request, to inspect the voting check list 2 and either of the two numbered lists of voters maintained by the 3 county board: Provided, That the watcher shall not mark upon or 4 alter these official election records. The judge of elections 5 shall supervise or delegate the inspection of any requested 6 documents.
