- 8 Section 1. Section 121 of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30,
- 9 No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, added June 30,
- 10 2012 (P.L.684, No.82), is amended to read:
- 11 Section 121. Keystone Exams. -- [Subject to annual
- 12 appropriation, not later than the 2020-2021 school year, the]
- 13 (a) The Department of Education shall develop and implement
- 14 Keystone Exams in [the following subjects:] algebra I,
- 15 literature[, biology, English composition, algebra II, geometry,
- 16 United States history, chemistry, civics and government and
- 17 world history.] and biology, as required by the No Child Left
- 18 Behind Act of 2001 (Public Law 107-110, 115 Stat. 1425) or any
- 19 <u>successor statute.</u> The State Board of Education shall promulgate

- 1 regulations, subject to the act of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633,
- 2 No.181), known as the "Regulatory Review Act," necessary to
- 3 implement this section.
- 4 (b) Notwithstanding section 2604-B(b)(2)(v), 22 Pa. Code §
- 5 <u>4.24 (relating to high school graduation requirements) or 4.51</u>
- 6 <u>(relating to State assessment system) or any statute or</u>
- 7 regulation to the contrary, neither the Department of Education
- 8 nor the State Board of Education may establish any minimum level_
- 9 of student performance on a Keystone Exam or any other Statewide
- 10 <u>assessment as a graduation requirement.</u>
- 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
