A JOINT RESOLUTION

1 2 3	Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, further providing for exemptions and special provisions.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby resolves as follows:
6	Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of
7	Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with Article XI:
8	That section 2(c) of Article VIII be amended to read:
9	§ 2. Exemptions and special provisions.

11	(c) Citizens and residents of this Commonwealth[, who served
12	in any war or armed conflict in which the United States was
13	engaged and were honorably discharged or released under
14	honorable circumstances from active service,] who served in the
15	United States Armed Forces, including a reserve component or
16	National Guard, and were discharged or released from service
17	under conditions other than dishonorable shall be exempt from

1 the payment of all real property taxes upon the residence 2 occupied by the said citizens and residents of this Commonwealth 3 imposed by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or any of its political subdivisions if, as a result of military service, they 4 are blind, paraplegic or double or quadruple amputees or have a 5 service-connected disability declared by the United States 6 7 Veterans Administration or its successor [to be a total or 100% 8 permanent disability, and if the State Veterans' Commission determines that such persons are in need of the tax exemptions 9 10 granted herein]. This exemption shall be [extended to the 11 unmarried surviving spouse upon the death of an eligible veteran 12 provided that the State Veterans' Commission determines that 13 such person is in need of the exemption] granted for the 14 lifetime of such persons regardless of income.

15 Section 2. (a) Upon the first passage by the General Assembly of this proposed constitutional amendment, the 16 17 Secretary of the Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to comply with the advertising requirements of section 1 of Article 18 19 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the 20 required advertisements to two newspapers in every county in which such newspapers are published in sufficient time after 21 22 passage of this proposed constitutional amendment.

23 Upon the second passage by the General Assembly of this (b) 24 proposed constitutional amendment, the Secretary of the 25 Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to comply with the 26 advertising requirements of section 1 of Article XI of the 27 Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the required advertisements to two newspapers in every county in which such 28 newspapers are published in sufficient time after passage of 29 30 this proposed constitutional amendment. The Secretary of the

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Commonwealth shall submit this proposed constitutional amendment to the qualified electors of this Commonwealth at the first primary, general or municipal election which meets the requirements of and is in conformance with section 1 of Article XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and which occurs at least three months after the proposed constitutional amendment is passed by the General Assembly.
