AN ACT

1	Amending the act of December 22, 1983 (P.L.327, No.85),
2	entitled, as amended, "An act imposing regulations and
3	licensing requirements on auctioneers, apprentice
4	auctioneers, auction houses, auction companies and trading
5	assistants; imposing powers and duties on the State Board of
6	Auctioneer Examiners; and making repeals," further providing
7	for the title of the act, for definitions, for auctioneer and
8	apprentice auctioneer licenses; providing for sales exempt
9	from license requirements; further providing for status of
10	existing licensees and for applications for initial and
11	renewal licenses; providing for registration of trading
12	assistants and trading assistant companies; further providing
13	for special licensees to furnish bond and for authority to
14	transact business not transferable; repealing provisions
15	relating to auction house license, auction company license,
16	trading assistant registration and nonresident licensees;
17	further providing for reciprocity with other states;
18	repealing provisions relating to licensee and registrant to
19	furnish bond; further providing for no other license or
20	registration required and for list of licensees and
21	registrants; providing for contracts; further providing for
22	records of sales; repealing provisions relating to contracts
23	for conduct of transaction; and further providing for display
24	of licenses, for investigations and enforcement actions, for
25	escrow account, for hearing on charges, for administration
26	and enforcement, for revocation or suspension of license or
27	registration, for issuance of new license or registration
28	pending investigation and decision, for issuance of new
29	license or registration after revocation, for penalties, for
30	actions by unlicensed persons prohibited and for the State

1 Board of Auctioneer Examiners.

2 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 3 hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The title and sections 2 and 3 of the act of
December 22, 1983 (P.L.327, No.85), known as the Auctioneer
Licensing and Trading Assistant Registration Act, amended
October 8, 2008 (P.L.1080, No.89), are amended to read:

9 Imposing regulations and licensing requirements on auctioneers, 10 apprentice auctioneers, auction [houses, auction] companies, 11 <u>trading assistants</u> and trading [assistants] <u>assistant</u>

14 Section 2. Definitions.

15 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall 16 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 17 context clearly indicates otherwise:

18 "Apprentice auctioneer." [A person] <u>An individual</u> who is 19 licensed under this act as an apprentice auctioneer.

20 "Auction" or "sale at auction."

21 (1)The offer [to sell] for sale of property [by an 22 auctioneer or apprentice auctioneer to the members of an 23 audience congregated for the purpose of making bids for the 24 purchase of the property] through the solicitation of bids_ 25 from one or more potential buyers in an effort [by the 26 auctioneer or apprentice auctioneer] to advance the amount of the bids to obtain the highest or most favorable offer, 27 regardless of the venue or method of conducting the sale. 28 29 (2) The term "auction" or "sale at auction" includes:

30 <u>(i) live auctions;</u>

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1	(ii) online auctions;
2	(iii) real-time auctions;
3	(iv) extended auctions; and
4	(v) any similar such events as may be devised with
5	the development of technology, or otherwise involving the
6	sale of property and the advancement of the price through
7	a bidding process.
8	(3) The term "auction" or "sale at auction" excludes any
9	sale conducted through an online [Internet bidding platform]
10	trading assistant consignment sale transaction.
11	(4) The term "auction" or "sale at auction" shall not be
12	limited by technology existing on the effective date of this
13	paragraph.
14	"Auction company." [A company which, as part of its
15	business, arranges, manages, sponsors, advertises or carries out
16	auctions.] <u>A legally recognized entity that sells or attempts to</u>
17	sell property at auction or performs, or offers to perform, any
18	of the functions or activities requiring licensure as an auction
19	company under section 3(a)(1). The term includes any legally
20	recognized entity that holds itself out as engaged in the
21	business of selling property at auction.
22	"Auction house." An established place of business,
23	including, but not limited to, an auction barn, a sale barn and
24	a sale pavilion, <u>used primarily for conducting auctions,</u> where
25	two or more auctions are held within any 12-month period and
26	where representations are regularly made that property is sold
27	at auction. The term does not include premises where isolated <u>or</u>
28	periodic sales are conducted by an auctioneer or auctioneer
29	apprentice and [which] that are used primarily for purposes
30	other than auctions or sales at auction.
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1	"Auctioneer." [A person] <u>An individual</u> who sells or offers
2	or attempts to sell property at auction. The term includes [any
3	person who holds] <u>an individual who:</u>
4	(1) Engages in or offers the calling for and recognition
5	of bids at auction.
6	(2) Engages in or offers any of the activities of an
7	auction company.
8	(3) Performs, or offers to perform, any of the functions
9	or activities requiring licensure under section 3(a)(1).
10	(4) Holds himself out as engaged in the business of
11	selling property at auction.
12	"Auctioneer-of-record." The licensed auctioneer designated
13	by an auction company as its auctioneer-of-record. The
14	auctioneer-of-record is principally responsible for the conduct
15	of the auctions of the auction company in accordance with this
16	<u>act.</u>
17	"Board." The State Board of Auctioneer Examiners [in the
18	Department of State].
19	"Commissioner." The Commissioner of Professional and
20	Occupational Affairs in the Department of State.
21	"Department." The Department of State.
22	"Extended auction." An auction conducted in whole or in part
23	online at which bids are received over an extended period of
24	time identified by a starting time and ending time that may
25	encompass multiple minutes, hours, days or other periods.
26	"Group A auction school." A provider, approved by the board,
27	offering a course of study in auctioneering and the auction
28	industry, as approved by the board, the completion of which
29	requires not less than 20 credit hours, including two credit
30	hours of practicum or cooperative practical experience.
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1 "Group B auction school." A provider, approved by the board, offering a course of study in auctioneering and the auction 2 3 industry, as approved by the board, the completion of which requires fewer than 20 credit hours. 4 5 "Legally recognized entity." A partnership, association, corporation, limited liability company or other entity 6 7 recognized under the laws of this Commonwealth or any other 8 state. 9 "Licensee." [A person licensed under this act including an 10 auctioneer, apprentice auctioneer, holder of a special license and, in the case of an auction house or company, the person 11 required to obtain the license.] An individual licensed under 12 this act as an auctioneer, apprentice auctioneer or holder of a 13 14 special license and a legally recognized entity licensed under this act as an auction company. 15 16 "Live auction." An auction or sale at auction at which one 17 or more members of an audience are present in person, are 18 communicating telephonically or by other digital or electronic 19 means or are participating by absentee bid. 20 "Online auction." An auction or sale at auction conducted over the Internet or similar interactive communication media. 21 22 ["Online Internet bidding platform." Hardware or software 23 architecture that provides or enables computer access by 24 multiple users to an interactive computer server for the purpose 25 of allowing users to offer property for sale and that does not examine, set the price or prepare the description of the 26 property to be offered.] 27 "Online trading assistant consignment transaction." A 28 29 transaction pursuant to which a registrant or licensee describes and lists personal property of another for sale through the use 30

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of hardware or software that enables computer access by multiple 1 2 users to an interactive computer server: (1) allowing individual sellers, and those acting on 3 behalf of sellers, to list and offer the property for sale at 4 a set price, or best offer, or through competitive and 5 progressive offers that may include a buy-it-now feature; and 6 7 (2) allowing prospective buyers access to the hardware 8 or software. "On-site auction." An auction or sale at auction conducted 9 10 at the seller's residential or business location where the property to be sold is located. 11 "Person." An individual[, partnership, association, 12 13 corporation, limited liability company or other] or a legally 14 recognized entity. "Property." Real and personal property, including both 15 tangible and intangible personal property. The term includes, 16 but is not limited to, domestic animals and farm products. 17 "Qualified [auctioneer] <u>sponsor</u>." A currently licensed 18 auctioneer residing in this Commonwealth. 19 20 "Real-time auction." An auction or sale at auction at which bids are solicited and received contemporaneously, in real time. 21 22 "Registrant." A person registered under this act as a 23 trading assistant or a trading assistant company. 24 "Seller." The owner of property, or the legal representative or agent of the owner of property, who consigns or otherwise 25 26 agrees to have the property sold at auction or by way of an online trading assistant consignment sale transaction. 27 "Special licensee." The holder of a special license issued 28 29 pursuant to section 3. "Temporary venue." A venue, including a rented hall, used 30

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1	primarily for other purposes, at which an auction or sale at
2	auction is held by an auction company or an auctioneer,
3	regardless of the frequency of the auctions or sales at auction.
4	"Trading assistant." An individual who, for a commission or
5	fee, conducts or intends to conduct a business within this
6	Commonwealth of [accepting personal property to sell on behalf
7	of another through an online Internet bidding platform.]
8	selling, or offering to sell, the personal property of another
9	through an online trading assistant consignment sale
10	transaction, or who performs, or offers to perform, any of the
11	functions or activities requiring registration under section
12	<u>5.1(a).</u>
13	"Trading assistant company." A legally recognized entity
14	that for a commission or fee, conducts or intends to conduct a
15	business within this Commonwealth of selling, or offering to
16	sell, the personal property of another through an online trading
17	assistant consignment sale, or that performs, or offers to
18	perform, any of the functions or activities requiring
19	registration under section 5.1(a).
20	Section 3. Auctioneer [and], apprentice auctioneer, auctioneer
21	company and special licenses.
22	(a) Requirement for license[Notwithstanding section 10.1,
23	it]
24	(1) It is unlawful for any person to engage in [or carry
25	on] the <u>business or</u> profession of <u>an</u> auctioneer, <u>apprentice</u>
26	auctioneer or an auction company to conduct [a sale at] an
27	auction, to hold himself out as an auctioneer or as an
28	apprentice auctioneer, to hold itself out as an auction
29	<u>company</u> or to offer to conduct [sales at auction] <u>auctions</u> in
30	this Commonwealth without first obtaining [from the board] a
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1 license from the board as an auctioneer [or apprentice 2 auctioneer. Any member, officer or employee of a partnership, 3 association or corporation who attempts to sell at auction or who is actively engaged in the auction profession must have a 4 5 license as an auctioneer or apprentice auctioneer.], apprentice auctioneer, auction company or special licensee. 6 (2) (i) Regardless of whether the computer system or 7 8 server utilized in connection with an online auction is physically located within this Commonwealth, a license 9 10 shall be required for any person offering to conduct or agreeing to conduct an online auction, or conducting an 11 12 online auction, if: 13 (A) the seller is situate in this Commonwealth 14 at the time the offer is made, the agreement is made or the online auction is held; 15 (B) the online auction involves the sale of real 16 17 property situate in this Commonwealth; or 18 (C) the online auction involves the sale of 19 personal property situate in this Commonwealth at the 20 time the offer is made, the agreement is made or the 21 online auction is held. 22 (ii) Under this section, licensure is not required 23 under circumstances in which the seller initiates contact 24 with an auctioneer, auction company or other provider of 25 auction services located outside of this Commonwealth to 26 sell personal property at an online auction outside of 27 this Commonwealth. (3) Any owner, member, officer, employee or independent 28 29 contractor retained by an auction company who calls bids or engages in other activities requiring licensure under this 30

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1 act must be licensed as an auctioneer or apprentice 2 auctioneer. Notwithstanding the foregoing, a license is not required for an individual, acting as an agent or 3 representative of a licensee under this act, to negotiate or 4 execute contracts on behalf of the licensee. 5 (4) Licensees under this act shall be authorized to 6 7 conduct auctions at any venue within this Commonwealth, 8 including on-site auctions and auctions held at auction 9 houses and temporary venues, and by any method of conducting the sale, including live auctions and online auctions and 10 11 auctions that are conducted live and online 12 contemporaneously, whether real-time auctions or extended 13 auctions. 14 Issuance and supervision of licenses.--It is the duty [(b)] of the board, upon payment of the license fees required and upon 15 16 compliance with the requirements of this act, to issue a license 17 as an auctioneer or apprentice auctioneer to individuals or as 18 an auctioneer to partnerships, associations and corporations who 19 qualify under and comply with this act. The board shall 20 supervise and control all licenses issued under this act.] 21 (c) Qualifications in general for license.--[Licenses] 22 Auctioneer, apprentice auctioneer and special auctioneer 23 licenses shall be granted only to [persons] individuals who have 24 a good reputation for honesty, truthfulness, integrity and 25 competence to transact the business of an auctioneer or 26 apprentice auctioneer in a manner as to safequard the interest of the public and only after satisfactory proof of these 27 28 qualifications has been presented to the board as required by 29 this act and regulation. 30 (d) [Qualifications for apprentice] <u>Apprentice</u> auctioneer

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1 license. -- To qualify for an apprentice auctioneer license, [a 2 person] an individual must be sponsored and employed for 3 compensation by a qualified [auctioneer] sponsor who employs no more than one other apprentice auctioneer. As approved by the 4 board, an apprentice auctioneer may transfer his apprenticeship 5 to another qualified sponsor without forfeiting any qualifying 6 auctions previously completed in accordance with subsection (e) 7 8 (1).

9 (e) [Qualifications for auctioneer] <u>Auctioneer</u> license.--To 10 qualify for an auctioneer license, [a person] <u>an individual</u> must 11 have passed the prescribed examination after [having]:

12 [served] serving an apprenticeship as a licensed (1)13 apprentice auctioneer for a period of not less than two years 14 in the employ of a qualified [auctioneer] sponsor and 15 [participated] participating for compensation in no less than 16 30 auctions[;], including auctions under the supervision of a 17 substitute qualified sponsor, without limitation as to the method of conducting the auctions, which may include online 18 19 auctions; [or]

20 (2) successfully [completed] <u>completing</u> a prescribed
21 course of study in auctioneering [of at least 20 credit hours
22 at a school approved by the board.] <u>at a Group A auction</u>
23 school;

(3) successfully completing a prescribed course of study
in auctioneering at a Group B auction school and served an
apprenticeship as a licensed apprentice auctioneer for a
period of not less than one year in the employ of a qualified
sponsor, and participating for compensation in no less than
15 auctions, which may include auctions under the supervision
of a substitute qualified sponsor, without limitation as to

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1	the format of the auctions, which may include online
2	auctions;
3	(4) being licensed in good standing by another state to
4	engage in auctioneering for at least two years. The board
5	shall review applications under this paragraph to determine
6	the qualifications of the applicant; or
7	(5) demonstrating that the individual has conducted
8	auctioneering for at least two years in a state that does not
9	require a license. The board shall review applications under
10	this paragraph to determine the qualifications of the
11	applicant.
12	(e.1) Auction company license
13	(1) Every legally recognized entity shall, before
14	operating as an auction company, obtain an auction company
15	license issued by the board.
16	(2) Every auction company shall designate an auctioneer-
17	of-record. Each auction company licensed under this act shall
18	designate an individual licensed as an auctioneer under this
19	act to serve as the auction company's auctioneer-of-record.
20	The designation of the auctioneer-of-record shall be made in
21	the initial application for licensure as an auction company
22	and in each application for renewal of an auction company
23	license. The auctioneer-of-record may be an owner,
24	<u>shareholder, member, partner, employee, independent</u>
25	contractor or other agent of the auction company. The
26	auctioneer-of-record is principally responsible for the
27	conduct of the auctions of the auction company in accordance
28	with this act. However, nothing in this act shall limit or
29	restrict the ability of an auction company to utilize the
30	services of one or more auctioneers in addition to the

1	auctioneer identified as auctioneer-of-record, and it shall
2	not be necessary for the auctioneer-of-record to be present
3	at every auction conducted by the auction company, provided
4	that a licensed auctioneer is present to conduct the
5	activities required to be conducted by a licensed auctioneer
6	under this act. An auction company license becomes invalid if
7	the license of the auctioneer-of-record is not renewed or is
8	suspended or revoked or if the auctioneer-of-record becomes
9	deceased or otherwise ceases to be the auction company's
10	auctioneer-of-record without substitution by a successor
11	auctioneer-of-record.
12	(3) Within 30 calendar days after an auction company's
13	auctioneer-of-record ceases to serve as auctioneer-of-record
14	for the auction company, both the auction company and the
15	auctioneer-of-record or the auctioneer-of-record's legal
16	representative shall notify the board in writing of the
17	termination of such status.
18	(f) [Qualifications for license reissued after long
19	inactivity] <u>Reissuance of inactive license</u> Any [person]
20	individual to whom an auctioneer [or apprentice auctioneer]
21	license has been issued and [who has been inactive as an
22	auctioneer or apprentice auctioneer for a period of seven years
23	without renewing the license issued to him shall be required to
24	submit to and pass an examination approved by the board prior to
25	having a license reissued to him.] whose license has been in an
26	inactive or nonrenewed status for a period of seven or more
27	years shall be required to submit to and pass an examination
28	approved by the board prior to having a license reissued. Any
29	individual to whom an apprentice auctioneer license has been
30	issued and whose license has been in an inactive or nonrenewed
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1 status for a period of seven or more years shall be required to

2 make a new application to the board.

3 [(q) Designation of auctioneer-of-record.--If the applicant for a license is a partnership, association or corporation, then 4 a member of the partnership or association or an officer of the 5 corporation, who is licensed in this Commonwealth as an 6 7 auctioneer, must be designated as the auctioneer-of-record. The 8 auctioneer-of-record is principally responsible for the conduct of the auctions of the partnership, association or corporation 9 10 in accordance with this act. A partnership, association or corporation auctioneer license becomes invalid if the license of 11 12 the auctioneer-of-record is not renewed or is suspended or 13 revoked.]

14 (q.1) Special license to conduct auction. -- An auctioneer or 15 auction company authorized to engage in auctioneering in another 16 state shall, on application and payment of the license fee, be 17 issued a special license for each specifically identified 18 auction to be conducted in this Commonwealth. Applications must 19 be made not less than 20 days in advance of the auction or sale 20 at auction and must include the name and address of the seller or owner of all items to be sold. All applications are subject 21 22 to approval by the board and shall include proof of authority to 23 engage in auctioneering in the other state. This subsection does 24 not prohibit an auctioneer or auction company licensed in another state from working or sharing compensation with a 25 26 licensed Pennsylvania auctioneer or auction company in this 27 Commonwealth with respect to an auction conducted pursuant to a contract between the seller or owner of the property and an 28 29 auctioneer or auction company licensed in this Commonwealth and, under such circumstances, a special license shall not be 30

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required unless the out-of-State auctioneer will call bids or 1 engage in any other conduct that requires a license under this 2 3 act. Sales exempt from license requirements.--4 [(h) 5 The requirement to obtain a license under this act does not apply to sales at auction in the following circumstances: 6 7 To a specified single sale per year conducted by the (1)8 owner of property if the owner is not engaged in the business 9 of selling the property and if the property is owned by the 10 person in an individual capacity. 11 To a sale conducted by or on behalf of a charitable (2)12 organization if the person conducting the sale receives no 13 compensation therefor. 14 (3) To a sale conducted by or on behalf of a person 15 appointed by judicial order or decree. To a sale conducted in the settlement of any 16 (4) 17 decedent's estate. 18 (5)To a sale conducted by or under the direction of any 19 public authority. 20 To any sale required by law to be at auction. (6) 21 Special license to conduct auction. -- An auctioneer (i) 22 authorized to engage in auctioneering in another state shall, 23 upon application and payment of the license fee, be issued a 24 special license for each auction conducted by him. Applications 25 must be made 20 days in advance of the sale and must include the 26 name and address of the consignor or owner of all items to be 27 sold. All applications are subject to approval by the board and shall include proof of authority to engage in auctioneering in 28 29 the other state.]

23	(c) Licensed auction housesAn auction house license
24	issued under and pursuant to this act and existing on the
25	effective date of this paragraph shall remain in full force and
26	effect until the license shall expire and shall not be subject
27	to renewal. Thereafter, auction house licenses will no longer be
28	issued or renewed in this Commonwealth, and any holder of an
29	expired auction house license who is not also the holder of an
30	auction company license shall be required to obtain either an
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1 auction company license or an auctioneer license in order to
2 continue in the business and profession of auctioneering in this
3 Commonwealth.
4 Section 4. Section 5 of the act, amended October 8, 2008
5 (P.L.1080, No.89), is amended to read:

6 Section 5. Applications for initial and renewal licenses <u>and</u>
7 <u>examination</u>.

8 (a) Application for auctioneer license.--Applications for license as an auctioneer shall be made to the board in writing 9 10 [upon] on forms provided by the board which shall contain such information as [to the individual or, if the applicant is a 11 12 partnership, association or corporation, as to its members or 13 officers, as] the board requires. If the applicant is an 14 individual, the application shall be signed by that individual. If the applicant is a partnership or an association, the 15 16 application shall be signed by a member. If the applicant is a 17 corporation, the application shall be signed by an officer. (a.1) <u>Apprenticeship.--</u>An application by a licensed 18 19 apprentice auctioneer seeking to qualify on the basis of an 20 apprenticeship shall contain or be accompanied by satisfactory 21 evidence that the applicant [was] meets one of the following:

22 (1) Was in the employ of [a sponsor] one or more 23 <u>qualified</u> sponsors for at least two years <u>total</u> and 24 participated for compensation in not less than 30 auctions on 25 the dates and at the locations provided by the applicant. 26 [Upon the filing of an application, the board shall 27 investigate the allegations contained in the application and 28 if, upon investigation, it finds the allegations untrue, it] 29 (2) Was in the employ of one or more qualified sponsors for at least one year total and participated for compensation 30

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1 in not less than 15 auctions on the dates and at the locations provided by the applicant and successfully 2 completed a course of study in auctioneering at a Group B 3 auction school. 4 (a.2) Group A auction school attendance. -- An application by 5 an applicant seeking to qualify on the basis of having completed 6 7 a course of study in auctioneering at a Group A auction school 8 shall contain or be accompanied by satisfactory evidence that 9 the applicant has completed such course of study. 10 (a.3) Affidavit.--Each application for licensure as an auctioneer shall include a self-affirming affidavit, in a form 11 12 as prescribed by the board, attesting to the truth and accuracy_ 13 of the statements contained in the application. If an applicant 14 makes false or misleading statements in an application, the board may refuse to examine or license the applicant or may 15 16 revoke any license issued to the applicant on the basis of materially untrue allegations contained in the application for a 17 18 license. The board shall set forth in writing its findings and 19 reasons for its refusal or revocation and furnish a copy to the 20 applicant.

21 Application for apprentice auctioneer license.--(b) Applications for license as an apprentice auctioneer shall be 22 23 made to the board in writing [upon] on forms provided by the 24 board which shall contain such information as to the applicant 25 as the board requires. For license renewals, the licensee shall 26 set forth the period of time, if any, during which [he] the apprentice auctioneer was engaged in the auction profession, 27 28 stating the name of [his present] the apprentice auctioneer's 29 current qualified sponsor and any former qualified sponsor for the period of five years immediately preceding the date of the 30

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renewal. Escrow account. 20 Every [auctioneer] <u>licensee</u> and registrant shall 21 [immediately] promptly deposit moneys, received from the sale of 22 property, belonging to others in a separate custodial or trust 23 fund account maintained by the [auctioneer or trading assistant] 24 licensee or registrant until the transaction involved is 25 terminated, at which time the [auctioneer or trading assistant] 26 licensee or registrant shall account for the full amount received. Such moneys received by a licensee or registrant_ 27 28 working for an auction company or trading assistant company 29 shall be promptly turned over to such company for deposit and 30 accounting.

3 Section 22. Hearing on charges.

4 (a) General rule.--If the applicant [or], licensee or
5 registrant desires, the board shall grant a hearing upon the
6 charges. The [said hearings] hearing may be held by the board or

7 (c) Revocation of license or registration of legally 8 recognized entity for violation by member or officer .-- In the 9 event of the revocation or suspension of the license or 10 <u>registration</u> issued to any member of a partnership or to any officer of an association [or], corporation, limited liability 11 12 company or other entity, the license or registration issued to 13 the [partnership, association or corporation] legally recognized_ 14 entity shall be revoked by the board unless, within a time fixed 15 by the board, the connection of the member of the partnership is 16 severed and his interest in the partnership and his share in its activities brought to an end or the officer of the association 17 18 [or], corporation, limited liability company or other entity is discharged and has no further participation in its activities. 19 20 Section 27. Issuance of new license or registration pending 21 investigation and decision.

Pending an investigation or proceeding before the board 22 23 affecting any licensee or registrant and pending final decision 24 upon any appeal taken by a licensee or registrant from the 25 ruling of the board, no new registration may be issued or license may be issued to a licensee or to a partnership of which 26 27 he is a member or employee or to an association [or], 28 corporation, limited liability company or other entity of which he is an officer or employee except for the period of the 29 investigation or proceeding and subject to the action of the 30

4 (a) General rule.--After the revocation of any license or
5 registration, no new license or registration may be requested by
6 or issued to the same licensee or registrant within a period of

9 the conditions of this act, at any time thereafter.

10 (b) Criminal conduct. -- No license or registration shall be issued by the board to any person known by it to have been, 11 12 within five years, convicted of forgery, embezzlement, obtaining 13 money under false pretenses, extortion, criminal conspiracy to 14 defraud or other like offense, or to any copartnership of which 15 any person is a member or to any association [or], corporation, 16 limited liability company or other entity of which any person is an officer or employee or in which as a stockholder any person 17 18 has or exercises a controlling interest either directly or 19 indirectly.

20 Section 29. Penalties.

(a) Criminal penalties.--Any person who engages in or
carries on the profession or acts in the capacity of [an
auctioneer, apprentice auctioneer, auction house, auction
company or trading assistant] <u>a licensee or registrant</u> in this
Commonwealth without a current license or registration or who
employs any [person] <u>individual</u> without a current license [as an
apprentice auctioneer] <u>or registration</u>:

(1) For a first offense, commits a summary offense and
shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine not
exceeding \$500 or to imprisonment not exceeding three months,

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1 or both.

(2) For a second or subsequent offense, commits a
misdemeanor of the third degree and shall, upon conviction,
be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than \$2,000 but not
more than \$5,000 or to imprisonment for not less than one

8 (1) In addition to any other civil remedy or criminal 9 penalty provided for in this act, the board, by a vote of the 10 majority of the maximum number of the authorized membership 11 of the board as provided by law or by a vote of the majority 12 of the duly qualified and confirmed membership or a minimum 13 of four members, whichever is greater, may levy a civil 14 penalty of up to [\$1,000] <u>\$10,000</u> on any person:

15 (i) who engages in the <u>business or</u> practice of 16 auctioneering without being properly licensed to do so 17 under this act[.]; or

18 (ii) who engages in business as a trading assistant
