AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," establishing parent involvement programs and policies in school districts and the school 5 health services task force. 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding sections

- 12 to read:
- 13 Section 528. Parent Involvement Programs and Policies. -- (a)
- The board of school directors in a school district of the first 14
- 15 class, first class A, second class, third class or fourth class
- 16 shall establish a parent involvement program, parent involvement
- 17 policy and parent involvement committee. No school entity shall
- 18 be required to establish a new program or policy under this
- section if one currently exists and reasonably fulfills the 19
- requirements of this section. 20

- 1 (b) A parent involvement program established by a board of
- 2 school directors shall include the following:
- 3 (1) Identification of existing resources, activities or
- 4 materials in the school district that may be used by parents to
- 5 improve the academic achievement of students in the school
- 6 district.
- 7 (2) Identification of existing resources, activities or
- 8 <u>materials in the school district that may be used by parents to</u>
- 9 <u>improve or supplement techniques used by parents at home to</u>
- 10 support and improve the academic achievement of students in the
- 11 school district.
- 12 (3) Identification of a districtwide system of communicating
- 13 information between parents and school officials regarding the
- 14 curriculum, academic goals and strategic plan of the school
- 15 district.
- 16 (4) Identification of any supplemental academic services
- 17 available to students whose score on any Pennsylvania System of
- 18 School Assessment test is below proficient.
- 19 (5) Identification of any mechanism through which parents
- 20 can provide recommendations to the board of school directors
- 21 regarding programs that may improve the academic achievement of
- 22 <u>students in the school district.</u>
- 23 (6) Identification of any mechanism through which the school
- 24 district can provide information to parents regarding resources,
- 25 activities or materials in the school district that may be used
- 26 by parents to improve the academic achievement of their
- 27 students.
- 28 (c) A parent involvement policy established by a board of
- 29 <u>school directors shall include the following:</u>
- 30 (1) Identification of goals and objectives for the

- 1 <u>involvement of parents in the improvement of the academic</u>
- 2 achievement of students in the school district.
- 3 (2) Identification of specific strategies to meet the goals
- 4 and objectives required under paragraph (1).
- 5 (3) Explanation of the resources, activities, materials and
- 6 mechanisms identified in the parent involvement program.
- 7 (4) Explanation of the role of the parent involvement
- 8 <u>committee established under subsection (d).</u>
- 9 (d) A parent involvement committee established by a board of
- 10 school directors shall consist of parents of students enrolled
- 11 <u>in the school district and shall be responsible for providing</u>
- 12 the board of school directors with recommendations on the school
- 13 <u>district's parent involvement program and parent involvement</u>
- 14 policy. If a school district currently has established a
- 15 committee of parents that makes recommendations on school
- 16 policies, the board of school directors may utilize that
- 17 committee to meet the requirements of this subsection.
- 18 (e) A board of school directors shall provide for the
- 19 publication and dissemination of information related to the
- 20 school district's parent involvement program and parent
- 21 involvement policy. The board of school directors shall:
- 22 (1) Provide a copy of the parental involvement policy to the
- 23 parent or quardian of each student enrolled in the district.
- 24 (2) Make copies of the parent involvement program and parent
- 25 <u>involvement policy available for inspection in the</u>
- 26 administrative office of the school district and provide copies
- 27 upon request.
- 28 (3) Provide copies of the parent involvement program and
- 29 parent involvement policy to the Department of Education no
- 30 later than sixty (60) days from the effective date of this

- 1 <u>section</u>.
- 2 Section 1425. School Health Services Task Force. -- (a) The
- 3 General Assembly finds that:
- 4 (1) School health personnel deliver valuable services that
- 5 address the physical, mental, emotional and social health of
- 6 their students.
- 7 (2) The ways and means by which those health services are
- 8 provided vary across school districts and regions across this
- 9 <u>Commonwealth.</u>
- 10 (3) While student health issues are increasing in
- 11 complexity, earlier this decade the number of school nurse
- 12 certificates issued by the Department of Education showed a
- 13 trend to decline, and State subsidies for school district health
- 14 services have remained relatively flat over the past five years.
- 15 <u>(4) Studies project a shortage of registered nurses in</u>
- 16 Pennsylvania and nationally, school districts face numerous
- 17 challenges in providing health services to students.
- 18 (b) (1) There is established a task force on school health
- 19 services. The task force shall consist of ten members composed
- 20 of the following individuals:
- 21 (i) Two members of the Senate, one each to be chosen by the
- 22 President pro tempore and the Minority Leader of the Senate.
- 23 (ii) Two members of the House of Representatives, one each
- 24 chosen by the Majority Leader and the Minority Leader of the
- 25 House of Representatives.
- 26 (iii) One member chosen by the Secretary of Education from
- 27 <u>among persons recommended by the Department of Education.</u>
- 28 (iv) One representative from each of the following:
- 29 (A) An organization representing school nurses.
- 30 (B) An organization representing school board directors.

- 1 (C) An organization representing school administrators.
- 2 (D) An organization representing school business officials.
- 3 (E) An organization representing school principals.
- 4 (2) The members shall be appointed within thirty days of the
- 5 <u>effective date of this section. Names shall be furnished to the</u>
- 6 <u>Secretary of Education. A majority of the members of the task</u>
- 7 force shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
- 8 Official action by the task force shall require the approval of
- 9 <u>a majority of the members of the task force. The task force</u>
- 10 shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson. If there
- 11 is a vacancy for any cause, a replacement shall be appointed in
- 12 the same way with the same qualifications as set forth in this
- 13 <u>section and shall hold office for the unexpired portion of the</u>
- 14 term. Members of the task force shall not be entitled to
- 15 <u>compensation or reimbursement and shall serve as volunteers on</u>
- 16 the task force.
- 17 (3) The task force shall convene no later than sixty days
- 18 after the effective date of this section. The task force is
- 19 <u>authorized to hold hearings</u>, take testimony and make its
- 20 investigations at such places in this Commonwealth as it deems
- 21 necessary. The task force shall meet at such times and places
- 22 specified by the call of the chairperson or of a majority of the
- 23 members of the task force. In undertaking its investigations
- 24 regarding school health services, the task force shall do all of
- 25 the following:
- 26 (i) Adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task
- 27 force.
- 28 (ii) Meet and conduct hearings with representatives of the
- 29 <u>public school districts of this Commonwealth, including, but not</u>
- 30 limited to, school administrators and school health providers,

- 1 school board members, representatives of the Department of
- 2 Education and the Department of Health and other health
- 3 <u>officials and medical professionals.</u>
- 4 (iii) Identify, evaluate and make recommendations on topics
- 5 involved with school health care, including, but not limited to,
- 6 the following:
- 7 (A) The number of school nurse certifications issued
- 8 <u>annually by the Department of Education over the last ten years.</u>
- 9 (B) The number of waivers and emergency certification
- 10 permits issued for school nurses annually by the Department of
- 11 Education over the last ten years, both across this Commonwealth
- 12 and by region.
- 13 (C) The number of other school health personnel employed
- 14 over the last ten years by districts under Article XIV.
- 15 (D) The cost of delivering school health services mandated
- 16 by law and as otherwise provided by the district.
- 17 (E) Availability and coordination of Federal and State
- 18 funding for school nurse services.
- 19 (F) Best practices to improve school health services in this
- 20 Commonwealth's public schools.
- 21 (G) Alternative health care services, programs and staffing
- 22 options that could assist school districts in offering a
- 23 flexible and comprehensive delivery of school health services in
- 24 this Commonwealth's public schools.
- 25 (iv) Make and transmit a report of its activities, findings
- 26 and recommendations, including possible legislation, to the
- 27 <u>chairperson of the Public Health and Welfare Committee of the</u>
- 28 Senate, the chairperson of the Education Committee of the
- 29 Senate, the chairperson of the Health Committee of the House of
- 30 Representatives and the chairperson of the Human Services

- 1 Committee of the House of Representatives and the chairperson of
- 2 the Education Committee of the House of Representatives within
- 3 one year of the task force's first meeting.
- 4 (c) The Department of Education and the Department of Health
- 5 shall provide staff support to the task force.
- 6 (d) The task force shall cease to exist upon the receipt by
- 7 <u>all four committee chairpersons of the task force's report as</u>
- 8 <u>described in subsection (b)(3)(iv), unless it is reestablished</u>
- 9 by action of the General Assembly.
- 10 (e) As used in this section:
- "School nurse" shall have the same meaning as under section
- 12 1401.
- "Task force" means the task force on school health services
- 14 established under this section.
- 15 Section 2. This act shall take effect as follows:
- 16 (1) The addition of section 528 of the act shall take
- 17 effect in 180 days.
- 18 (2) The addition of section 1425 of the act shall take
- 19 effect in 60 days.
- 20 (3) This section shall take effect immediately.
