- 1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, in riot, disorderly conduct and
- related offenses, providing for civil and criminal immunity.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 5511(q) of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding definitions and the
- 8 section is amended by adding a subsection to read:
- 9 \S 5511. Cruelty to animals.
- 10 * * *
- 11 (p.1) Immunity. -- A licensed doctor of veterinary medicine,
- 12 <u>certified veterinary technician or veterinary assistant who</u>
- 13 reports, in good faith and in the normal course of business, a
- 14 suspected incident of animal cruelty to the proper authority
- 15 shall be immune from liability in a civil or criminal action
- 16 brought against the licensed doctor of veterinary medicine,

- 1 <u>certified veterinary technician or veterinary assistant for</u>
- 2 reporting the incident.
- 3 (q) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 4 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 5 subsection:

- 8 <u>3(13) of the act of December 27, 1974 (P.L.995, No.326), known</u>
