14	Section 1. Section 301 of the act of August 26, 1971
15	(P.L.351, No.91), known as the State Lottery Law, amended
16	November 21, 1996 (P.L.741, No.134), is amended to read:
17	Section 301. Statement of purpose.
18	This chapter is enacted to establish a lottery to be operated
19	by the State, the net proceeds of which are to be used after
20	June 30, 1972, for the purposes of providing property tax relief
21	for the elderly for taxes paid in 1971 and thereafter to persons
22	65 years of age or older and for providing certain free fixed

route local transit services to persons 65 years of age or older 1 2 and reduced fare on group ride transit service to persons 65 3 years of age or older. It is further intended to provide a means through which to curb illegal gambling operations in 4 Pennsylvania[.] and to provide a source of funds for the 5 repayment of indebtedness on bonds issued for mass transit_ 6 7 development by a government agency or authority. 8 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read: Section 304.1. Special lottery sales. 9 (a) Special lotteries. -- The secretary shall conduct annually 10 at least 12 lotteries for the purpose of providing a source of 11 12 funds for the repayment of indebtedness on bonds issued for the 13 development of mass transit as economic development projects by a government agency or authority. For lotteries conducted for 14 this purpose, the price of each ticket or share shall be \$5. 15 16 (b) Identification of special lotteries. -- In all advertising and on tickets, the secretary shall identify any lottery under 17 18 this section as being conducted for the benefit of the name and 19 location of the project. 20 (c) Deposit of revenues. -- Notwithstanding the provisions of section 303(a)(11), the secretary shall deposit all revenues 21 received under this section, following the payment of prizes to 22 23 holders of winning tickets or shares and the payment of costs 24 incurred in the operation and administration of the lottery, 25 including the expenses of the division and the costs resulting 26 from any contract or contracts entered into for promotional, advertising or operational services or for the purchase or lease 27 28 of lottery equipment and materials in the special fund in the 29 State Treasury, to be known as the Economic Development Fund for Mass Transit. 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1 Transit shall be used solely for the purposes described under

3 (d) Unclaimed prize money. -- Unclaimed prize money on a winning lottery ticket or share sold under this section shall be 4 retained by the secretary for payment to the person entitled 5 thereto for one year after the drawing in which the prize was 6 7 won. If no claim is made within such period, the prize money 8 shall be paid into the Economic Development Fund for Mass Transit and used for purposes provided under this section. 9 Section 3. Sections 311, 313 and 314 of the act, amended 10 November 21, 1996 (P.L.741, No.134), are amended to read: 11 12 Section 311. Disposition of funds.

13 (a) State Lottery Fund. -- [All] Except as provided in section_ 14 <u>304.1</u>, moneys received from the operation of the State lottery 15 shall be deposited in a State Lottery Fund which is hereby 16 created. Such moneys shall be used to the extent necessary for the payment of lottery prizes but the amount so used shall not 17 18 be less than 40% of the amount of which tickets or shares have 19 been sold. All payments of lottery prizes and for expenses of 20 operation of the lottery shall be made as provided by law. All moneys remaining after payment of prizes and operating expenses 21 shall remain in the State Lottery Fund and shall be allocated 22 23 for the purpose of providing property tax relief for the elderly 24 for taxes paid in 1971 and thereafter pursuant to the provisions of [the act of March 11, 1971 (P.L.104, No.3), known as the 25 26 Senior Citizens Rebate and Assistance Act] Chapter 13 of the act of June 27, 2006 (1st Sp.Sess., P.L.1873, No.1), known as the 27 28 Taxpayer Relief Act, and for the purpose of providing free or 29 reduced fare transit service for the elderly pursuant to Chapter 9 and the act of February 11, 1976 (P.L.14, No.10), known as the 30

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Pennsylvania Rural and Intercity Common Carrier Surface 1 2 Transportation Assistance Act. In the event sufficient funds are 3 not available from the lottery receipts to meet the requirements of the Senior Citizens Rebate and Assistance Act or for 4 providing free or reduced fare transit service for the elderly 5 under Chapter 9 and the Pennsylvania Rural and Intercity Common 6 7 Carrier Surface Transportation Assistance Act, additional funds to fulfill these obligations shall be appropriated from the 8 9 General Fund for this purpose.

10 (b) Appropriations.--The moneys in said State Lottery Fund11 shall be appropriated only:

12 (1) For the payment of prizes to the holders of winning13 lottery tickets or shares.

14 (2) For the expenses of the division in its operation of15 the lottery.

16 (3) For property tax relief and free or reduced fare
17 transit service for the elderly as provided under subsection
18 (a).

19 Section 313. Unclaimed prize money.

[Unclaimed] Except as provided in section 304.1, unclaimed prize money on a winning lottery ticket or share shall be retained by the secretary for payment to the person entitled thereto for one year after the drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within such period, the prize money shall be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes as otherwise herein provided.

27 Section 314. Deposits and transactions.

The secretary may, in his discretion, require any or all lottery sales agents to deposit to the credit of the State Lottery Fund <u>or, where applicable, the Economic Development Fund</u>

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for Mass Transit, in banks, designated by the State Treasurer, 1 2 all moneys received by such agents from the sale of lottery tickets or shares, less the amount, if any, retained as 3 compensation for the sale of the tickets or shares, and to file 4 with the secretary or his designated agents reports of their 5 receipts and transactions in the sale of lottery tickets in such 6 7 form and containing such information as he may require. The 8 secretary may make such arrangements for any person, including a bank, to perform such functions, activities or services in 9 connection with the operation of the lottery as he may deem 10 advisable pursuant to this chapter and the rules and regulations 11 12 of the department, and such functions, activities or services 13 shall constitute lawful functions, activities and services of 14 such person.

15 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
