OF THE PENNSYLVANIA CONSOLIDATED STATUTES ARE AMENDED TO READ: 11 12 § 3112. Traffic-control signals. * * * 13 14 (b.1) Pedalcycle or motorcycle. <--15 (1) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the 16 contrary, the driver of a pedalcycle or motorcycle

- 1 approaching an intersection that is controlled by a traffic
- 2 <u>control signal utilizing a vehicle detection device that is</u>
- 3 <u>inoperative due to the size of the pedalcycle or motorcycle</u>
- 4 <u>shall come to a full and complete stop at the intersection</u>
- 5 <u>and, after exercising due care as provided by law, may</u>
- 6 proceed with due caution when it is safe to do so.
- 7 (2) It is not a defense to a violation of subsection (a)
- 8 <u>(3) that the driver of a pedalcycle or motorcycle proceeded</u>
- 9 under the belief that a traffic control signal utilized a
- 10 vehicle detection device or was inoperative due to the size
- 11 <u>of the pedalcycle or motorcycle when the signal did not</u>
- 12 <u>utilize a vehicle detection device or that any device was not-</u>
- 13 <u>in fact inoperative due to the size of the pedalcycle or</u>
- 14 <u>motorcycle.</u>

- 16 (C) INOPERABLE OR MALFUNCTIONING SIGNAL.--IF A TRAFFIC-
- 17 CONTROL SIGNAL IS OUT OF OPERATION OR IS NOT FUNCTIONING
- 18 PROPERLY, <u>INCLUDING</u>, <u>BUT NOT LIMITED TO</u>, <u>A SIGNAL THAT USES</u>
- 19 INDUCTIVE LOOP SENSORS, OR OTHER AUTOMATED TECHNOLOGY, TO DETECT

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- 20 THE PRESENCE OF VEHICLES THAT FAILS TO DETECT A VEHICLE,
- 21 VEHICULAR TRAFFIC FACING A:
- 22 (1) GREEN OR YELLOW SIGNAL MAY PROCEED WITH CAUTION AS
- 23 INDICATED IN SUBSECTION (A) (1) AND (2).
- 24 (2) RED OR COMPLETELY UNLIGHTED SIGNAL SHALL STOP IN THE
- 25 SAME MANNER AS AT A STOP SIGN, AND THE RIGHT TO PROCEED SHALL
- 26 BE SUBJECT TO THE RULES APPLICABLE AFTER MAKING A STOP AT A
- 27 STOP SIGN AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 3323 (RELATING TO STOP SIGNS
