## AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in community colleges, further providing for the definition of "community college," for 6 powers and duties of State Board of Education and Board of 7 Trustees, for degrees and for dissolution of certain 8 community colleges. 9 10 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 11 12 Section 1. Section 1901-A(4) of the act of March 10, 1949 13 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, 14 amended July 13, 2005 (P.L.226, No.46), is amended to read: 15 Section 1901-A. Definitions .-- The following words and phrases, as used in this article, shall, unless a different 16 17 meaning is plainly required by the context, have the following 18 meaning: 19 20 (4) "Community college" shall mean a public college or 21 technical institute which is established and operated in

- 1 accordance with the provisions of this act by a local sponsor
- 2 which provides a two-year, four-year, postsecondary, college-
- 3 parallel, terminal-general, terminal-technical, out-of-school
- 4 youth or adult education program or any combination of these.
- 5 The community college may also provide area vocational-technical
- 6 education services and credit, nonremedial college courses to
- 7 secondary senior high school students.

- 9 Section 2. Sections 1902-A(a)(1), 1905-A(a) and 1912-A of
- 10 the act, added July 1, 1985 (P.L.103, No.31), are amended to
- 11 read:
- 12 Section 1902-A. Powers and Duties of State Board of
- 13 Education. -- (a) The State Board of Education shall have the
- 14 power, and its duty shall be:
- 15 (1) To adopt such policies, standards, rules and regulations
- 16 formulated by the Council of Higher Education, as may be
- 17 necessary to provide for the establishment, operation and
- 18 maintenance of community colleges, including minimum
- 19 requirements for physical facilities and equipment, curriculum,
- 20 faculty, standards and professional requirements, qualifications
- 21 for admission and advancement of students, student enrollment,
- 22 student population of the area to be served by the community
- 23 college, requirements for satisfactory completion of a two-year
- 24 or four-year program and the degrees or diplomas or certificates
- 25 to be awarded therefor, means of financing and financial
- 26 resources for the establishment and support of the community
- 27 college, standards under which the State Board of Education may
- 28 <u>allow a community college to offer baccalaureate degrees and</u>
- 29 standards under which the State Board of Education shall
- 30 determine the baccalaureate degrees a community college may be

- 1 <u>allowed to offer</u> and all matters necessary to effectuate the
- 2 purposes of this act.

- 4 Section 1905-A. Powers and Duties of Board of Trustees.--(a)
- 5 The affairs of any community college established under this act
- 6 shall be administered and supervised by a board of trustees.
- 7 Subject to any law and to any policies, standards, rules and
- 8 regulations adopted by the State Board of Education provided for
- 9 community colleges, the board shall, for the purpose of
- 10 establishing, operating and maintaining a community college,
- 11 have the power, and its duty shall be:
- 12 (1) To appoint and fix the salary of a president.
- 13 (2) To hold, rent, lease, sell, purchase and improve land,
- 14 buildings, furnishings, equipment, materials, books and
- 15 supplies.
- 16 (3) To enter into contracts for services with schools,
- 17 colleges or universities, or with school districts or
- 18 municipalities, to effectuate the purposes of this act.
- 19 (4) To accept and receive gifts of real and personal
- 20 property and Federal, State and local moneys and grants, and to
- 21 expend the same.
- 22 (5) To make policies providing for the admission and
- 23 expulsion of students, the degrees to be offered, the courses of
- 24 instruction, the tuition and fees to be charged and for all
- 25 matters related to the government and administration of the
- 26 college.
- 27 (6) To submit to the State Board of Education for its
- 28 approval proposed amendments to the community college plan,
- 29 including any proposal to offer baccalaureate degrees pursuant
- 30 to section 1912-A(b).

- 1 (7) To enter into contracts for services to high schools of
- 2 member districts to provide area vocational-technical education
- 3 services.
- 4 (8) To exercise such other powers and perform such other
- 5 duties as are necessary to carry into effect the purposes of
- 6 this act.

- 8 Section 1912-A. Degrees.--(a) The State Board of Education
- 9 shall prescribe the types of diplomas, certificates or degrees
- 10 that may be granted students who complete post-secondary
- 11 education courses in community colleges.
- (b) (1) Upon request by an established community college to
- 13 amend its community college plan to allow the community college
- 14 to offer baccalaureate degree programs, the State Board of
- 15 Education may allow a community college to offer baccalaureate
- 16 degree programs where the State Board of Education determines
- 17 that both of the following apply:
- 18 <u>(i) The community college:</u>
- 19 (A) is located in a rural geographic area of this
- 20 Commonwealth;
- 21 (B) is located in a geographic area that is underserved by
- 22 other colleges or universities offering baccalaureate degrees;
- 23 or
- (C) seeks to offer a baccalaureate degree program that is
- 25 not offered by any other college or university serving the
- 26 geographic area in which the community college is located; and
- 27 <u>(ii) The board of trustees of the community college has</u>
- 28 demonstrated that each local sponsor of the community college
- 29 has approved the request by resolution adopted by a majority
- 30 vote at a public meeting of the local sponsor.

- 1 (2) In approving the request of a community college to offer
- 2 baccalaureate degree programs pursuant to this subsection, the
- 3 State Board of Education shall specify the baccalaureate degree
- 4 programs the community college is allowed to offer.
- 5 (3) The State Board of Education shall promulgate
- 6 regulations pursuant to the act of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633,
- 7 No.181), known as the "Regulatory Review Act," in order to
- 8 <u>implement this subsection.</u>
- 9 Section 3. Section 1914-A(c) of the act, added June 22, 2001
- 10 (P.L.530, No.35), is amended to read:
- 11 Section 1914-A. Dissolution of Certain Community Colleges.--
- 12 \* \* \*
- 13 (c) The corporate successor of a dissolved community college
- 14 shall continue to have the authority to grant <a href="mailto:baccalaureate">baccalaureate</a>
- 15 <u>degrees</u>, associate degrees and certificates in those programs in
- 16 which the dissolved community college had the authority to grant
- 17 degrees during the last complete school year of operation as a
- 18 community college. If a corporate successor desires to offer
- 19 additional associate degree programs, it must apply to the
- 20 Department of Education to obtain approval in accordance with
- 21 applicable regulations. If a corporate successor desires to
- 22 offer additional certificates, it shall apply for licensure to
- 23 the State Board of Private Licensed Schools. [A corporate
- 24 successor of a dissolved community college is not authorized to
- 25 award baccalaureate degrees.] If a corporate successor desires
- 26 to offer baccalaureate degree programs, it must apply to the
- 27 State Board of Education pursuant to section 1912-A(b).

- 29 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
