AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An
- act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- laws relating thereto," in preliminary provisions, providing
- for county assessments.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 10 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
- 11 section to read:
- 12 Section 121.1. County assessments. -- (a) The State Board, in
- 13 consultation with every board of school directors located in
- 14 <u>each county, shall develop a county-wide assessment for use in</u>
- 15 each school entity in the county. The assessment shall be
- 16 administered by the school entity to assess student proficiency
- 17 <u>levels.</u>
- 18 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law or regulation
- 19 to the contrary, student demonstration of proficiency of the
- 20 <u>academic standard measured in a county-wide assessment shall not</u>

- 1 be a requirement of eligibility for high school graduation.
- 2 (c) The requirement under subsection (a) shall be in place
- 3 of and not in addition to any Statewide administered assessment.
- 4 (d) For the purposes of this section, the following words
- 5 <u>and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this</u>
- 6 <u>subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 7 (1) "Assessment." A measurement of student performance on a
- 8 set of academic standards in a subject area to determine if the
- 9 <u>student met certain performance level expectations required to</u>
- 10 <u>achieve proficiency in alignment with Federal or State academic</u>
- 11 <u>standards. The assessment may be established under Federal or</u>
- 12 State law, regulation or department initiative or as part of a
- 13 <u>waiver process regardless of whether it is implemented as a</u>
- 14 requirement of the law, regulation or initiative, voluntarily by
- 15 the Commonwealth or as a condition for participation in a grant
- 16 program. The assessment may be in the form of a national
- 17 standardized assessment, a department created assessment or an
- 18 <u>assessment developed in conjunction with a consortium.</u>
- 19 Assessment shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
- 20 <u>(i) The Pennsylvania System of School Assessment (PSSA)</u>
- 21 test.
- 22 (ii) A Keystone Exam or another test established by the
- 23 State board to meet the requirements of section 2603-B(d)(10)(i)
- 24 and required under the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (Public
- 25 Law 107-110, 115 Stat. 1425) or its successor Federal statute.
- 26 (iii) A test or assessment established by the State Board to
- 27 meet the requirements of section 9401 of the Elementary and
- 28 Secondary Education Act (Public Law 89-10, 20 U.S.C. § 7861)
- 29 <u>flexibility waiver application submitted by the department.</u>
- 30 (iv) A project-based assessment established under 22 Pa.

- 1 <u>Code § 4.51c (relating to project-based assessment).</u>
- 2 (v) A local assessment established under 22 Pa. Code § 4.52
- 3 (relating to local assessment system).
- 4 (2) "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 5 <u>Commonwealth</u>.
- 6 (3) "School entity." A school district, charter school,
- 7 cyber charter school, joint school, area vocational-technical
- 8 school or intermediate unit.
- 9 (4) "State board." The State Board of Education of the
- 10 <u>Commonwealth</u>.
- 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
