AN ACT

- Providing for rural telephone access and availability and for functions of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; and
- making a gross receipts tax determination.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Short title.
- 7 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Rural
- 8 Telephone Access and Availability Act.
- 9 Section 2. Declaration of policy.
- 10 The General Assembly finds and declares it is the policy of
- 11 the Commonwealth to maintain the provision of landline telephone
- 12 service to residents of this Commonwealth by supporting Federal
- 13 and State universal service objectives which provide that
- 14 telecommunications services should be available to all consumers
- 15 at reasonable rates.

- 1 Section 3. Definitions.
- 2 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 3 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 4 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 5 "Basic calling service." Service which provides a
- 6 residential customer with a stand-alone single line or a
- 7 business customer with fewer than four stand-alone lines having
- 8 the ability to transmit and receive voice communications,
- 9 including access to E-911 service. The term excludes wireless
- 10 service.
- "Commission." The Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission.
- "Fund." The Universal Service Fund under 52 Pa. Code
- 13 63.163(c) (relating to universal service fund administration)
- 14 and 47 CFR Pt. 54 (relating to universal service).
- "Local exchange telecommunications company." As defined in
- 16 66 Pa.C.S. § 3012 (relating to definitions).
- "Rural telecommunications carrier." As defined in 66 Pa.C.S.
- 18 § 3012.
- 19 Section 4. Investigation.
- 20 (a) Requirement. -- The commission shall initiate an
- 21 investigation of the fund and 52 Pa. Code Ch. 63 Subch. L
- 22 (relating to universal service).
- 23 (b) Procedure. -- The investigation shall be undertaken as an
- 24 on-the-record proceeding.
- 25 (c) Order and rulemaking.--
- 26 (1) By January 1, 2021, the commission shall enter a
- 27 final order containing the findings of the investigation. The
- 28 following apply:
- 29 (i) The order shall contain a determination of
- 30 whether continuation of the fund is necessary to maintain

reasonable rates by rural telecommunications carriers or
to support the provisioning of basic calling service in
exchanges served by rural telecommunications carriers. In
making the determination required by this subparagraph,
the commission shall consider the following:

- (A) The impact on the customers of a rural telecommunications carrier regardless of carrier size or affiliates.
- (B) Any viable alternative revenue source derived from services regulated by the commission or funding which may be available to rural telecommunications carriers to support the provision of basic calling service if the commission reduces the funding level of the fund.
- (ii) If the commission determines that the fund is necessary to maintain reasonable rates by rural telecommunications carriers or to support the provisioning of basic calling service in exchanges served by rural telecommunications carriers, its final order shall contain examination of and determinations regarding each of the following:
 - (A) The appropriate base of fund contributors and recipients.
 - (B) The appropriate total funding level of the fund.
 - (C) Expansion of the fund to include support for the networks of local exchange telecommunications companies for the provision of broadband at levels established by the Federal Communications Commission.
 - (D) Expansion of the fund to establish a State

- 2 to low-income customers.
- 3 (2) Within 30 days of entry of the order under paragraph
- 4 (1), the commission shall initiate a rulemaking proceeding to
- 5 implement findings supporting changes to the fund.
- 6 (3) The order and the rulemaking shall consider all
- 7 relevant requirements of the Federal Communications
- 8 Commission.
- 9 Section 5. Fund.
- 10 (a) Continuing administration. -- Except as set forth in
- 11 subsection (b), the commission shall continue to administer the
- 12 fund until January 1, 2022, on the same terms and conditions as
- 13 set forth in 52 Pa. Code Ch. 63 Subch. L (relating to universal
- 14 service) and orders in effect on the effective date of this
- 15 section.
- 16 (b) Exceptions.--The following shall apply to administration
- 17 under subsection (a):
- 18 (1) Distribution of money from the fund shall be limited
- 19 to a rural telecommunications carrier that:
- 20 (i) received money from the fund before January 2,
- 21 2015; and
- 22 (ii) offers a basic calling service in its
- certificated service territory pursuant to a tariff.
- 24 (2) Prior to January 1, 2022, amounts received by a
- 25 rural telecommunications carrier from the fund may not be
- reduced below the annual amount received in 2014.
- 27 (3) A rural telecommunications carrier that receives
- 28 money from the fund after December 31, 2014, and before
- 29 January 1, 2022:
- 30 (i) is obligated to provide basic calling service

- under 66 Pa.C.S. § 1501 (relating to character of service and facilities) throughout its certificated service
- 3 territory; and
- 4 (ii) is prohibited from declaring as competitive a
- 5 particular geographic area, exchange, or group of
- 6 exchanges under 66 Pa.C.S. § 3016(a) (relating to
- 7 competitive services) pending a final order entered by
- 8 the commission in the investigation under section 4.
- 9 (4) Except as set forth in paragraphs (1) and (2), the
- 10 commission shall not implement any other revision or change
- 11 to the fund or to 52 Pa. Code Ch. 63 Subch. L until January
- 12 1, 2022.
- 13 (5) All of the following shall be considered public
- records under the act of February 14, 2008 (P.L.6, No.3),
- known as the Right-to-Know Law, and shall be made available
- on the commission's publicly accessible Internet website:
- 17 (i) Names of contributors and their contributions to
- 18 the fund.
- 19 (ii) Names of recipients of money from the fund and
- the amount of money they receive.
- 21 Section 6. Gross receipts tax.
- 22 (a) Scope. -- This section applies to money received:
- 23 (1) through Federal funding under 47 CFR Pt. 54 Subpt. D
- 24 (relating to universal service support for high cost areas);
- 25 or
- 26 (2) from the fund.
- 27 (b) Status. -- Money referred to in subsection (a):
- 28 (1) does not constitute receipts from the transmission
- of telegraph or telephone messages; and
- 30 (2) is not subject to the tax imposed under section 1101

- of the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax
- 2 Reform Code of 1971.
- 3 Section 7. Expiration.
- 4 This act shall expire on the later of:
- 5 (1) the effective date of regulations promulgated under
- 6 section 4(c)(2); or
- 7 (2) January 1, 2022.
- 8 Section 8. Effective date.
- 9 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
