- 1 Subject to section 9602 (relating to regulations), the
- 2 following words and phrases when used in this chapter shall have
- 3 the meanings given to them in this section unless the context
- 4 clearly indicates otherwise:
- 5 "Commonwealth agency." As defined in 62 Pa.C.S. § 103
- 6 (relating to definitions).
- 7 "Executive agency." As defined in 62 Pa.C.S. § 103 (relating

- "Service-disabled veteran-owned small business." A small

- 29 discharged or released from the service under honorable
- 30 conditions.

- "Veteran-owned small business." A small business owned and
- 11 controlled by a veteran or veterans.

- 19 § 9602. Regulations.
- 20 (a) Promulgation. -- The Department of General Services shall
- 21 establish policy in accordance with this [chapter] subchapter
- 22 for executive agencies and independent agencies and may, in
- 23 consultation with the department, promulgate regulations
- 24 establishing detailed definitions of the words and phrases
- 25 defined in section 9601 (relating to definitions) using, in
- 26 addition to the criteria set forth in section 9601, other
- 27 criteria as it deems appropriate, including the number of
- 28 employees and the dollar volume of business.
- 29 (b) Implementation. -- State-affiliated entities shall
- 30 implement the policy for their procurement programs.

- 1 (c) Antifraud provisions. -- The Department of General
- 2 Services shall establish policy and promulgate regulations
- 3 establishing antifraud provisions to deter and penalize
- 4 businesses that are not owned by [those who are service-disabled **<--**
- 5 or by- veterans but who falsely claim that they are in order to <--
- 6 receive any action authorized by this [chapter] subchapter.
- 7 (d) Notice. -- Notice of the antifraud provisions and an
- 8 e-mail address and telephone number to report violations of the
- 9 antifraud provisions to the Department of General Services shall
- 10 be included, if feasible, in any application to be certified or
- 11 to be included in any source list authorized by this [chapter]
- 12 <u>subchapter</u>. The Department of General Services shall include in
- 13 its annual reports to the General Assembly information about the
- 14 number of businesses penalized for violating antifraud
- 15 provisions.
- 16 § 9603. Participation goal.
- 17 A Statewide annual goal of not less than 3% participation by

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- 18 veteran owned small businesses[, including service disabled
- 19 veteran-owned small businesses, is established. The
- 20 participation goal shall apply to the total value of all
- 21 contracts available to small businesses in each fiscal year.
- 22 § 9604. Duties of Department of General Services.
- 23 The Department of General Services, with the assistance of
- 24 the department, shall have the following duties:
- 25 (1) If feasible, provide appropriate staff, who shall be
- 26 responsible to the Department of General Services and who
- 27 shall serve within designated Commonwealth agencies to assist-
- 28 <u>veteran owned small businesses [and service disabled veteran </u>
- 29 <u>owned small businesses</u>] in this Commonwealth in learning how-
- 30 to do business with Commonwealth agencies.

- (2) Give special publicity to procurement procedures and issue special publications designed to assist veteran owned small businesses [and service disabled veteran owned small businesses] in learning how to do business with Commonwealth agencies.
 - (3) Compile, maintain and make available source lists of veteran-owned small businesses [and service disabled veteran-owned small businesses] for the purpose of encouraging procurement from veteran-owned small businesses.
 - (4) Include veteran owned small businesses [and service-disabled veteran owned small businesses] on solicitation-mailing lists.
 - (5) Assure that veteran owned small businesses [and service disabled veteran owned small businesses] are solicited on procurements for which the businesses may be suited.
 - (6) Develop special training programs to assist veteranowned small businesses [and service disabled veteran owned
 small businesses] in learning how to do business with
 Commonwealth agencies.
 - (7) Assure that participation by veteran owned small businesses [and service disabled veteran owned small businesses] is, if appropriate, factored into the evaluation of proposals for supplies, services or construction when a purchasing agency uses the competitive sealed proposals method under 62 Pa.C.S. § 513 (relating to competitive sealed proposals).
 - (8) Verify the current certification of businesses claiming to be certified as veteran owned small businesses fand service disabled veteran owned small businesses].

- 1 § 9605. Bonding and progress payments.
- 2 (a) Bonding. Notwithstanding 62 Pa.C.S. Pt. I (relating to
- 3 Commonwealth Procurement Code):
- 4 (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2), a purchasing
- 5 agency may reduce the level or change the types of bonding
- 6 normally required or accept alternative forms of security to
- 7 the extent reasonably necessary to encourage procurement from
- 8 veteran owned small businesses [and service disabled veteran-
- 9 <u>owned small businesses</u>].
- 10 (2) For contracts under \$25,000, veteran owned small
- 11 businesses [and service-disabled veteran-owned small-
- 12 businesses] shall be exempt from any bonding requirements.
- (b) Progress payments. A purchasing agency may make special-
- 14 provisions for progress payments as it deems reasonably
- 15 necessary to encourage procurement from veteran-owned small-
- 16 businesses [and service disabled veteran owned small-
- 17 businesses].
- 18 § 9607. Reports.
- 19 (a) Report to Department of General Services. -By August 15,
- 20 2013, and each August 15 thereafter, each executive agency and
- 21 independent agency shall submit an annual report for the period-
- 22 of July 1 to June 30 to the Department of General Services on
- 23 actual utilization of veteran-owned small businesses [and-
- 24 service-disabled veteran owned small businesses] as contractors,
- 25 subcontractors, suppliers and professional service providers.
- 26 (b) Report to standing committees.
- 27 (1) The Department of General Services and each State-
- 28 affiliated entity shall annually, before October 1, report in
- 29 writing to the Veterans Affairs and Emergency Preparedness
- 30 Committee of the Senate and the Veterans Affairs and

- 1 Emergency Preparedness Committee of the House of
- 2 Representatives the actual utilization, Statewide and by each
- 3 purchasing agency, of veteran-owned small businesses [and-
- 4 service disabled veteran owned small businesses] during the

- 21 As used in this subchapter, the following words and phrases
- 22 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 23 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- "Business fee." A fee required to be paid to the
- 25 Commonwealth or an instrumentality of the Commonwealth for
- 26 starting or opening a business within this Commonwealth. THE •
- 27 TERM DOES NOT INCLUDE A FEE FOR MAINTAINING LICENSURE OR OTHER
- 28 REQUIREMENT FOR CONTINUING TO OPERATE A BUSINESS.
- 29 <u>§ 9611. Exemption.</u>
- 30 (a) Payment. -- A veteran-owned small business shall be exempt

- 1 from the payment of a business fee.
- 2 (b) Proof.--A veteran must provide the department with proof
- 3 of the veteran's status using any of the following:
- 4 (1) A copy of a Federal DD-214 form.
- 5 (2) A copy of a Federal NGB-22 form.
- 6 (3) A valid Federal Veterans' Administration card.
- 7 (4) An identification card issued under 75 Pa.C.S. § <--
- 8 <u>1510(a.1) (relating to issuance and content of driver's</u>
- 9 <u>license</u>).
- 10 (c) Status. -- The Department of State, in consultation with
- 11 the department, shall OTHER COMMONWEALTH AGENCIES, MAY determine <--
- 12 <u>an applicant's status as a veteran in accordance with this</u>
- 13 <u>section</u>.
- 14 <u>(d) Offenses.--</u>
- 15 (1) A person who fraudulently obtains a business fee
- 16 <u>exemption commits a misdemeanor of the third degree.</u>
- 17 (2) A person assigning, transferring or attempting to
- 18 assign or transfer a business fee exemption or using or
- 19 <u>attempting to use a business fee exemption contrary to this</u>
- section commits a misdemeanor of the third degree.
- 21 (e) Reporting. -- The Department of State shall annually
