- 8 § 9715. Life imprisonment for homicide.
- 9 Mandatory life imprisonment. -- Notwithstanding the
- provisions of section 9712 (relating to sentences for offenses 10
- committed with firearms), 9713 (relating to sentences for 11
- 12 offenses committed on public transportation) or 9714 (relating
- 13 to sentences for second and subsequent offenses), any person
- 14 convicted of murder of the third degree or third degree murder
- of an unborn child under 18 Pa.C.S. § 2604(c) (relating to 15

- 1 <u>murder of unborn child)</u> in this Commonwealth who has previously
- 2 been convicted at any time of murder [or], voluntary
- 3 manslaughter, murder of an unborn child under 18 Pa.C.S. § 2604
- 4 or voluntary manslaughter of an unborn child under 18 Pa.C.S. §
- 5 <u>2605</u> (relating to voluntary manslaughter of an unborn child) in
- 6 this Commonwealth or of the same or substantially equivalent
- 7 crime in any other jurisdiction shall be sentenced to life
- 8 imprisonment, notwithstanding any other provision of this title
- 9 or other statute to the contrary.
