AN ACT

1 Designating a bridge on that portion of State Route 74 over the
2 Sherman's Creek, Spring Township, Perry County, as the PFC
3 William Oscar Stambaugh Memorial Bridge.

4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5 hereby enacts as follows:

6 Section 1. PFC William Oscar Stambaugh Memorial Bridge.

7 (a) Findings.--

8 (1) PFC William Oscar Stambaugh was one of the first
9 Perry County soldiers killed in World War II.

10 (2) Born April 25, 1920, PFC Stambaugh graduated from
11 Landisburg High School.

12 (3) After joining the Army on November 25, 1941, PFC
13 Stambaugh trained at Camp Lee, Virginia.

14 (4) PFC Stambaugh served with Company H 126 Infantry,
15 2nd Battalion, 32nd Infantry Division (Red Arrowmen).

16 (5) PFC Stambaugh was killed in combat on November 27,

1 1942, while serving in the infantry in Buna, New Guinea.

2 (6) PFC Stambaugh was posthumously awarded the Purple
3 Heart and the Presidential Citation.

4 (b) Designation.--The bridge located on State Route 74 in
5 Spring Township, Perry County, over the Sherman's Creek is
6 hereby designated the PFC William Oscar Stambaugh Memorial
7 Bridge.

8 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
9 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
10 traffic in both directions on the bridge.

11 Section 2. Effective date.

12 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
