AN ACT

Amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), entitled "An act relating to insurance; amending, revising, and consolidating the law providing for the incorporation of insurance companies, and the regulation, supervision, and protection of home and foreign insurance companies, Lloyds 5 associations, reciprocal and inter-insurance exchanges, and 6 fire insurance rating bureaus, and the regulation and 7 supervision of insurance carried by such companies, associations, and exchanges, including insurance carried by 9 the State Workmen's Insurance Fund; providing penalties; and 10 repealing existing laws," in casualty insurance, further 11 providing for autism spectrum disorders coverage. 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 13 14 hereby enacts as follows: 15 Section 1. Section 635.2(f)(2) and (g) of the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known as The Insurance Company Law of 16 1921, added July 9, 2008 (P.L.885, No.62), are amended to read: 17 18 Section 635.2. Autism Spectrum Disorders Coverage. -- * * * 19 (f) As used in this section: * * * 20 21 "Autism service provider" means any of the following: (2) 22 (i) A person, entity or group providing treatment of autism

- 1 spectrum disorders, pursuant to a treatment plan, that is
- 2 licensed or certified in this Commonwealth.
- 3 (ii) Any person, entity or group providing treatment of
- 4 autism spectrum disorders, pursuant to a treatment plan, that is
- 5 enrolled in the Commonwealth's medical assistance program on or
- 6 before the effective date of this section.
- 7 (iii) An individual who:
- 8 (A) is enrolled in or has completed a master's or higher
- 9 <u>degree program;</u>
- 10 (B) provides treatment of autism spectrum disorders,
- 11 pursuant to a treatment plan, in satisfaction of the experience
- 12 requirement of subsection (g)(2)(iv); and
- 13 (C) provides the treatment under the supervision of a
- 14 <u>licensed behavior specialist, licensed physician or licensed</u>
- 15 psychologist, except that the physical presence of the
- 16 <u>supervisor</u> is not required if the supervisor is readily
- 17 available for consultation.
- 18 * * *
- 19 (g) (1) The State Board of Medicine, in consultation with
- 20 the Department of [Public Welfare] Human Services, shall
- 21 promulgate regulations providing for the licensure or
- 22 certification of behavior specialists. Behavior specialists
- 23 licensed or certified by the State Board of Medicine shall be
- 24 subject to all disciplinary provisions applicable to medical
- 25 doctors as set forth in the act of December 20, 1985 (P.L.457,
- 26 No.112), known as the "Medical Practice Act of 1985." The State
- 27 Board of Medicine may charge reasonable fees as set by board
- 28 regulation for licensure or certificates or applications
- 29 permitted by the "Medical Practice Act of 1985."
- 30 (2) An applicant applying for a license or certificate as a

- 1 behavior specialist shall submit a written application on forms
- 2 provided by the State Board of Medicine evidencing and insuring
- 3 to the satisfaction of the board that the applicant:
- 4 (i) Is of good moral character.
- 5 (ii) Has received a master's or higher degree from a board-
- 6 approved, accredited college or university, including a major
- 7 course of study in school, clinical or counseling psychology,
- 8 special education, social work, speech therapy, occupational
- 9 therapy or another related field, or is a board-certified
- 10 behavior analyst.
- 11 (iii) Has at least one year of experience involving
- 12 functional behavior assessments, including the development and
- 13 implementation of behavioral supports or treatment plans.
- 14 (iv) Has completed at least one thousand (1,000) hours in
- 15 direct clinical experience with individuals with behavioral
- 16 challenges or at least one thousand (1,000) hours' experience in
- 17 a related field with individuals with autism spectrum disorders.
- 18 (v) Has completed relevant training programs, including
- 19 professional ethics, autism-specific training, assessments
- 20 training, instructional strategies and best practices, crisis
- 21 intervention, comorbidity and medications, family collaboration
- 22 and addressing specific skill deficits training.
- 23 (3) The board shall not issue a license or certificate to an
- 24 applicant who has been convicted of a felony under the act of
- 25 April 14, 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), known as "The Controlled
- 26 Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act," or if an offense
- 27 under the laws of another jurisdiction which, if committed in
- 28 this Commonwealth, would be a felony under "The Controlled
- 29 Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act," unless:
- 30 (i) At least ten (10) years have elapsed from the date of

- 1 conviction.
- 2 (ii) The applicant satisfactorily demonstrates to the board
- 3 that he has made significant progress in personal rehabilitation
- 4 since the conviction such that licensure of the applicant should
- 5 not be expected to create a substantial risk of harm to the
- 6 health and safety of his patients or the public or a substantial
- 7 risk of further criminal violations.
- 8 (iii) The applicant otherwise satisfies the qualifications
- 9 contained in or authorized by this section.
- 10 As used in this paragraph, the term "convicted" shall include a
- 11 judgment, an admission of guilt or a plea of nolo contendere.
- 12 (4) The State Board of Medicine shall issue a temporary
- 13 license to an applicant who meets all of the qualifications for
- 14 licensure, except for the requirements of paragraph (2) (iii),
- 15 (iv) and (v), subject to the following:
- 16 (i) A temporary license shall be granted to a graduate who
- 17 has received a master's or higher degree from a board-approved,
- 18 accredited college or university, including a major course of
- 19 study in school, clinical or counseling psychology, special
- 20 education, social work, speech therapy, occupational therapy or
- 21 another related field, or who is a board-certified behavior
- 22 analyst. The individual may only practice professional
- 23 behavioral specialist care under supervision and if the
- 24 individual holds a current temporary practice permit.
- 25 (ii) The physical presence of the supervising behavior
- 26 specialist, licensed physician or licensed psychologist is not
- 27 required if the supervisor is readily available for
- 28 consultation.
- 29 (iii) An individual who wishes to practice as a graduate
- 30 behavioral specialist during the period from the date of

- 1 completion of the educational program to the notification of
- 2 <u>licensure must submit an application for a temporary practice</u>
- 3 permit for a graduate behavioral specialist on a form provided
- 4 by the board and remit the required fees. A temporary practice
- 5 permit granted under this section is valid for up to five (5)
- 6 years from the date of issuance, unless extended by the board,
- 7 and shall immediately expire if the applicant fails to secure
- 8 licensure.
- 9 (iv) At least ninety (90) days prior to the expiration date
- 10 of the temporary practice permit, the graduate behavioral
- 11 specialist shall:
- 12 (A) Submit an application for licensure as a behavioral
- 13 specialist.
- 14 (B) Remit the board-specified fee.
- 15 (C) Submit the licensure registration form and fee.
- 16 (v) At least sixty (60) days prior to the expiration date of
- 17 the temporary practice permit, the graduate behavioral
- 18 specialist who wishes to extend the expiration date of the
- 19 temporary practice permit because of illness or extreme hardship
- 20 <u>shall:</u>
- 21 (A) Submit an application for temporary practice permit
- 22 extension on a form provided by the board.
- 23 (B) Remit the board-specified fee.
- 24 (C) Provide a detailed, written explanation of the reason
- 25 the extension is requested. If requesting an extension due to
- 26 illness, the applicant must provide certification of the illness
- 27 from the applicant's treating physician.
- 28 (vi) The board may not grant an extension to an individual
- 29 who fails to meet the requirements of subparagraph (v).

- 1 Section 2. The amendment of section 635.2(f)(2) and (g) of
- 2 the act shall be retroactive to July 9, 2011.
- 3 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
