7	Section 1. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
8	Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
9	<u>§ 5503.1. Inciting violence against law enforcement officer.</u>
10	(a) Offense definedA person commits a felony of the third
11	degree when the person willfully advocates violence against one
12	or more law enforcement officers that is likely to incite or
13	produce such violence.
14	(b) DefinitionsAs used in this section, the following
15	words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
16	subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
17	"Law enforcement officer." Any person who by virtue of the

- 1 person's office or public employment is vested by law with a
- 2 duty to maintain public order or to make arrests for offenses,

3 whether that duty extends to all offenses or is limited to

4 specific offenses, or any person on active State duty pursuant

- 5 to 51 Pa.C.S. § 508 (relating to active duty for emergency). The
- 6 term shall also include any member of any park police department
- 7 of any county of the third class.
- 8 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
