AN ACT

entitled, as amended, "An act providing for the prevention and control of communicable and non-communicable diseases including venereal diseases, fixing responsibility for disease prevention and control, requiring reports of diseases, and authorizing treatment of venereal diseases, and providing for premarital and prenatal blood tests; amending, revising and consolidating the laws relating thereto; and repealing certain acts," further providing for the title of the act, for definitions and for reports; providing for reports of data; and further providing for rules and regulations.
The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows:
Section 1. The title of the act of April 23, 1956 (1955
P.L.1510, No.500), known as the Disease Prevention and Control
Law of 1955, amended July 5, 1957 (P.L.495, No.279), is amended
to read:

11	(d.2) Drug overdose. An acute medical condition, including,
12	but not limited to, severe physical illness, coma, mania,
13	hysteria or death, which is the result of consumption or use of
14	one or more controlled substances causing an adverse reaction. A
15	patient's condition shall be deemed to be a drug overdose if a
16	prudent layperson, possessing an average knowledge of medicine
17	and health, would reasonably believe that the condition is in
18	fact a drug overdose and requires immediate medical attention.

20	(h.1) Overdose reversal. The life-saving act of
21	administering naloxone to a person experiencing a drug overdose.

23	Section 3. Section 4(a) of the act is amended to read:
24	Section 4. Reports
25	(a) Every physician who treats or examines any person who is
26	suffering from or who is suspected of having a communicable
27	disease <u>or drug overdose</u> , or any person who is or who is
28	suspected of being a carrier, shall make a prompt report of the
29	disease, overdose or overdose reversal in the manner prescribed
30	by regulation to the local board or department of health which
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serves the municipality where the disease occurs or where the
carrier resides or to the department if so provided by
regulation.

5 Section 4. The act is amended by adding a section to read: 6 Section 14.2. Reports of Data. -- The department shall report 7 county-level data on drug overdose and overdose reversals on a 8 quarterly basis. The reports shall be submitted to the Committee on Public Health and Welfare of the Senate and the Committee on 9 10 Health and Human Services of the House of Representatives and shall be posted on the department's publicly accessible Internet 11 12 website each quarter year. 13 Section 5. Section 16(a)(1), (2) and (12) of the act are 14 amended to read: 15 Section 16.
