- 1 Designating the week of January 25 through 31, 2015, as
- "Catholic Schools Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Catholic schools in this Commonwealth are
- 4 celebrating Catholic Schools Week during the week of January 25
- 5 through 31, 2015; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The theme for this year is "Catholic Schools:
- 7 Communities of Faith, Knowledge and Service"; and
- 8 WHEREAS, In the 2013-2014 school year, Catholic elementary
- 9 and secondary schools educate approximately 152,000 students and
- 10 save State and local taxpayers more than \$2 billion; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Catholic schools instill in young people a strong
- 12 foundation of values, self-esteem, self-confidence and
- 13 leadership skills; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Catholic schools, in providing young people with a
- 2 strong foundation of the values and academic skills needed in
- 3 becoming responsible citizens of this Commonwealth and this
- 4 nation, have a drop-out rate of less than 3% and a postgraduate
- 5 higher education rate of 90%; therefore be it
- 6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 7 week of January 25 through 31, 2015, as "Catholic Schools Week"
- 8 in Pennsylvania and express congratulations and appreciation to
- 9 Catholic elementary and secondary schools across this
