A RESOLUTION

1 2 3 4 5 6 7	Directing the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to conduct a comprehensive study on the flipped model of educational instruction, prepare a report on the history and proven effectiveness of this reversed class structure model and identify low-performing schools in this Commonwealth that the Department of Education should invite to participate in testing this model.
8	WHEREAS, The flipped-model concept involves a reversed
9	educational model, with videotaped lectures for viewing at home
10	and follow-up assignments to be completed in class; and
11	WHEREAS, This model began nearly eight years ago in the State
12	of Colorado, and this innovative idea has since spread to
13	schools around the country; and
14	WHEREAS, Teachers utilizing this flipped-model concept
15	videotape their lectures in a brief format which is made
16	available on schools' Internet websites for viewing by students
17	at convenient times, and at accessible locations such as a
18	school library or computer lab during extended hours; and
19	WHEREAS, The students come to class having been prepared by
20	viewing the videotape and are then given assignments to complete

- 1 during class time, when the teacher is available to provide
- 2 assistance and expertise and where students interact with each
- 3 other to help learn the material covered by the videotape; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Clintondale High School, a low-income school located
- 5 near Detroit, Michigan, has utilized the flipped model of
- 6 educating students for the past several years; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The utilization of the flipped model by Clintondale
- 8 High School has resulted in significant improvement in student
- 9 attendance, reversing student failure rates, improving scores on
- 10 statewide tests and reducing disciplinary incidents among
- 11 students; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Section 14 of Article III of the Constitution of
- 13 Pennsylvania requires the General Assembly to provide for the
- 14 maintenance and support of a thorough and efficient system of
- 15 public education to serve the needs of the Commonwealth; and
- 16 WHEREAS, By studying the flipped model of education, the
- 17 House of Representatives seeks to determine if it can better
- 18 meet this important constitutional obligation through
- 19 implementing the flipped model in this Commonwealth's public
- 20 schools; therefore be it
- 21 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the
- 22 Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to conduct a
- 23 comprehensive study on the flipped model of educational
- 24 instruction, and prepare a report on the history and proven
- 25 effectiveness of this reversed class structure model and
- 26 identify low-performing schools in this Commonwealth that the
- 27 Department of Education should invite to participate in testing
- 28 this model; and be it further
- 29 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee
- 30 submit a report to the members of the Education Committee of the

- 1 House of Representatives and to the Secretary of Education not
- 2 later than six months after the adoption of this resolution.
