INTRODUCED AS NONCONTROVERSIAL RESOLUTION UNDER RULE 35, MAY 11, 2015

A RESOLUTION

Designating May 31, 2015, as "Young Lungs at Play Day" to help provide model non-smoking behavior to children and youth and 2 help provide children, youth and their families with a safe, 3 4 smoke free environment. 5 WHEREAS, In Pennsylvania, more than 858,000 young people are exposed to tobacco smoke pollution every day; and 6 7 WHEREAS, The Surgeon General has stated that: (1)there is no safe level of exposure for a child whether indoors or outdoors; and a child's exposure to secondhand smoke causes 10 11 increased risk of sudden infant death syndrome, lower 12 respiratory infections, middle ear diseases, more severe 13 asthma, respiratory symptoms and slowed lung growth and is responsible for premature deaths of over 480,000 Americans 14 each year from lung cancer, heart disease, respiratory 15 16 illness and other diseases; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Secondhand smoke is responsible for over 50,000
- 2 deaths among nonsmokers each year; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Tobacco kills more Americans each year than alcohol,
- 4 cocaine, heroin, homicide, suicide, accidents, fire and AIDS
- 5 combined; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Eighty percent of smokers started smoking before 18
- 7 years of age, and the average initiation age is 12 years; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Every day an estimated 3,900 young people under 18
- 9 years of age try their first cigarette, and one-third of the
- 10 children will die prematurely from tobacco-related illnesses;
- 11 therefore be it
- 12 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate May 31,
- 13 2015, as "Young Lungs at Play Day" to help provide model
- 14 nonsmoking behavior to children and youth and help provide
- 15 children, youth and their families with a safe, smoke-free
- 16 environment; and be it further
- 17 RESOLVED, That "Young Lungs at Play Day" will help promote
- 18 the elimination of exposure to secondhand smoke at outdoor
- 19 public play areas by children; and be it further
- 20 RESOLVED, That "Young Lungs at Play Day" will help local
- 21 governments and community organizations support a tobacco-free
- 22 resolution or policy in their respective communities, making a
- 23 difference in the health and welfare of their community members.
