A RESOLUTION

- Designating September 27, 2015, as "First Responder Appreciation Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Most Pennsylvanians have benefited in some way from
- 4 the courageous service of first responders across this
- 5 Commonwealth; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Our first responders, police, fire, emergency
- 7 medical service and public health personnel, work selflessly on
- 8 behalf of the people of this Commonwealth, regardless of the
- 9 risk or hazard; and
- 10 WHEREAS, First responders carry out the critical role of
- 11 protecting and ensuring public safety in emergency situations;

- 2 WHEREAS, The men and women who bravely serve as first
- 3 responders have found themselves on the front lines of homeland
- 4 defense in the war against terrorism; and
- 5 WHEREAS, First responders are called upon in the event of
- 6 natural disasters, such as Superstorm Sandy; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Approximately 150,000 first responders perform these
- 8 crucial services in this Commonwealth; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Approximately 30,000 sworn police officers from
- 10 State, city and county law enforcement agencies protect lives
- 11 and property, detect and prevent crimes, uphold the law and
- 12 ensure justice; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Tens of thousands of firefighters, including
- 14 approximately 50,000 volunteers and 10,000 career firefighters,
- 15 provide fire suppression, emergency medical services, search and
- 16 rescue, hazardous materials response, terrorism response and
- 17 critical fire prevention and safety education; and
- WHEREAS, Approximately 60,000 emergency services
- 19 professionals in this Commonwealth respond to and treat a
- 20 variety of life-threatening emergencies, from cardiac and
- 21 respiratory arrest to traumatic injuries; and
- 22 WHEREAS, First responders make personal sacrifices to protect
- 23 our communities, as witnessed in the aftermath of the terrorist
- 24 attacks of September 11, 2001, and the natural destruction of
- 25 Hurricanes Katrina, Irene and Sandy and as called for every day
- 26 in cities and towns across this Commonwealth; and
- 27 WHEREAS, Many law enforcement officers die in the line of
- 28 duty in the United States each year, including four killed in
- 29 2014 in Pennsylvania alone; and
- 30 WHEREAS, Many firefighters are killed in the line of duty

- 1 across the United States each year and thousands more are
- 2 injured; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Many medics are injured on the job, have been
- 4 assaulted by patients or have been exposed to infectious
- 5 diseases; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Emergency medical service personnel in the United
- 7 States have a fatality rate of more than twice the national
- 8 average for all other workers; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Thousands of first responders have made the ultimate
- 10 sacrifice; and
- 11 WHEREAS, These men and women, by their dedicated
- 12 professionalism, have earned our gratitude and respect;
- 13 therefore be it
- 14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate
- 15 September 27, 2015, as "First Responder Appreciation Day" in
- 16 Pennsylvania to celebrate the contributions and sacrifices made
- 17 by all of this Commonwealth's first responders.
