## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the month of September 2015 as "Prostate Cancer
- 2 Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania and acknowledging the
- 3 importance of raising public awareness of the threat and
- 4 causes of prostate cancer.
- 5 WHEREAS, Prostate cancer is a disease in which normal cells
- 6 in the prostate gland begin to change and grow uncontrollably,
- 7 forming a mass called a tumor; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Some prostate cancers grow very slowly and may not
- 9 cause problems for years; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Prostate cancer is the most common type of cancer
- 11 diagnosed in men in the United States and is the most common
- 12 cancer among men in Pennsylvania; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Data published by the Pennsylvania Department of
- 14 Health show that prostate cancer accounted for the largest

- 1 number of all cancer cases diagnosed in men in Pennsylvania,
- 2 with 9,065 cases in 2014; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention
- 4 reports that prostate cancer is the second-leading cause of
- 5 cancer death in American men, behind only lung cancer; and
- 6 WHEREAS, One out of 7 men will be diagnosed with prostate
- 7 cancer in his lifetime and 1 out of 36 men nationwide will die
- 8 from prostate cancer; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The chance of developing prostate cancer rises
- 10 rapidly after 50 years of age, and almost two out of three
- 11 prostate cancers are found in men older than 65 years of age;
- 12 and
- 13 WHEREAS, Men whose fathers or brothers have prostate cancer
- 14 are twice as likely to develop the disease; and
- 15 WHEREAS, African-American men are 61% more likely than
- 16 Caucasian men to be diagnosed with prostate cancer and are twice
- 17 as likely to die from it; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Often there are no noticeable symptoms of prostate
- 19 cancer while it is in the early stages; however, symptoms of
- 20 more advanced prostate cancer may include difficult, frequent or
- 21 painful urination, blood in the urine or semen and pain in the
- 22 back, hips or pelvis that does not go away; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Nearly one-half of men do not realize that they are
- 24 at risk of developing prostate cancer; and
- 25 WHEREAS, Increasing awareness about prostate cancer and early
- 26 detection strategies is crucial to saving lives and preserving
- 27 and protecting families; therefore be it
- 28 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 29 month of September 2015 as "Prostate Cancer Awareness Month" in
- 30 Pennsylvania and acknowledge the importance of raising public
