A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing the month of September 2015 as "Newborn Screening Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Newborn screening is the practice of screening every
- 4 baby born prior to hospital discharge for certain harmful or
- 5 potentially fatal conditions that are not otherwise apparent at
- 6 birth; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Early detection of these conditions in newborns
- 8 facilitates timely interventions that result in significant
- 9 decreases in morbidity, mortality and disability; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Newborn screening is a comprehensive system that
- 11 includes testing, diagnosis, follow-up, treatment, education and
- 12 evaluation; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Every year more than 4 million newborns in the
- 14 United States and more than 140,000 newborns in this
- 15 Commonwealth undergo newborn screening; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Newborn screening was recently named in the Centers
- 2 for Disease Control and Prevention's publication entitled, "Ten
- 3 Great Public Health Achievements in the 20th Century"; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Newborn screening began in 1963 in the United States
- 5 with testing for phenylketonuria (PKU); and
- 6 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania began newborn screening with the
- 7 Newborn Child Testing Act in 1965 which required physicians,
- 8 hospitals and other institutions to administer or cause to be
- 9 administered tests for PKU and other metabolic diseases upon
- 10 infants in certain cases; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Since first enacted in 1965, the act has been
- 12 amended three times, most recently with Act 148 of 2014, which
- 13 expanded the list of required diseases for testing from 6 to 12;
- 14 and
- 15 WHEREAS, In addition to the required testing, Pennsylvania
- 16 provides newborn hearing screening, pulse oximetry testing for
- 17 critical congenital heart disease and follow-up screening and
- 18 services for other diseases; and
- 19 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth's Newborn Screening and Follow-up
- 20 Program is administered by the Pennsylvania Department of
- 21 Health; and
- 22 WHEREAS, 2015 marks the 50th anniversary of the
- 23 Commonwealth's newborn screening program; and
- 24 WHEREAS, "Newborn Screening Awareness Month" was started in
- 25 2000 by the Save Babies Through Screening Foundation, along with
- 26 several partner organizations to shine a national spotlight on
- 27 newborn screening and its detectable diseases; therefore be it
- 28 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 29 month of September 2015 as "Newborn Screening Awareness Month"
- 30 in Pennsylvania; and be it further

- 1 RESOLVED, That the Commonwealth officially recognize the
- 2 importance of awareness and encourage parents and future parents
- 3 to educate themselves on newborn screening and take the
- 4 necessary steps to ensure the health of their children.
