A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of May 2016 as "Building Safety Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Through continuing efforts to address critical
- 4 safety issues in the built environment that affect the residents
- 5 of this Commonwealth, regardless of age or occupation, both in
- 6 everyday life and in times of natural disaster, there is
- 7 confidence that structures are safe and sound; and
- 8 WHEREAS, This confidence is a result of the efforts of
- 9 vigilant quardians, building safety and fire prevention
- 10 officials, architects, engineers, builders and others in the
- 11 construction industry, who work year round to ensure the safe
- 12 construction of buildings; and
- 13 WHEREAS, These dedicated members of the Pennsylvania
- 14 Association of Building Code Officials, the International Code
- 15 Council's Pennsylvania State Professional Chapter and other

- 1 International Code Council Chapters in this Commonwealth,
- 2 including the Lancaster County Code Association, the Berks
- 3 County Building and Code Association, the Pennsylvania Building
- 4 Officials Conference, the Commonwealth Building Officials, the
- 5 Pennsylvania Association of Code Officials, the Pennsylvania
- 6 Association of Fire Code Officials, the Professional Chapter of
- 7 Western Pennsylvania and the Pennsylvania Building Officials
- 8 Conference Regions I and V, develop and implement the highest
- 9 quality codes to protect residents of this Commonwealth in the
- 10 buildings where they live, learn, work and play; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The International Codes, the most widely adopted
- 12 building safety and fire prevention codes in the nation, are
- 13 adopted in Pennsylvania by the Uniform Construction Code and are
- 14 used by most states, counties and cities in this nation; and
- 15 WHEREAS, These modern building safety codes also include
- 16 safeguards to protect the public from natural disasters such as
- 17 hurricanes, snowstorms, tornadoes, wildfires and earthquakes;
- 18 and
- 19 WHEREAS, "Building Safety Month," sponsored by the
- 20 International Code Council and the Pennsylvania Association of
- 21 Building Code Officials along with all of the other
- 22 International Code Council Chapters in this Commonwealth,
- 23 reminds the public about the critical role of their communities'
- 24 largely unknown quardians of public safety, local code
- 25 officials, who help prevent countless fires and accidents; and
- 26 WHEREAS, The theme for this year's "Building Safety Month" is
- 27 "Building Codes: Driving Growth Through Innovation, Resilience
- 28 and Safety"; and
- 29 WHEREAS, The theme focuses on appropriate steps that every
- 30 resident can take to ensure that the places where they live,

- 1 learn, work and play are safe; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Countless lives have been saved due to the
- 3 implementation of safety codes by State and local agencies; and
- WHEREAS, As "Building Safety Month" is observed throughout
- 5 this Commonwealth, it is important to consider projects to
- 6 improve building safety at home and in the community and to
- 7 acknowledge the essential service provided to all residents by
- 8 Federal agencies and State and local building departments in
- 9 protecting lives and property; therefore be it
- 10 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 11 month of May 2016 as "Building Safety Month" in Pennsylvania.
