## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing and honoring the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted
- Masons of Pennsylvania for its work and commitment to
- 3 children.
- 4 WHEREAS, The Fraternity of Free and Accepted Masons is the
- 5 oldest, largest and most widely known fraternal organization in
- 6 the world; and
- 7 WHEREAS, In 1717, four lodges of Freemasons meeting in
- 8 London, England, formed the first Grand Lodge; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The first Grand Lodge chartered Symbolic Lodges and
- 10 Provincial Grand Lodges in many countries, including the United
- 11 States; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Today there are 51 Grand Lodges in the United States
- 13 and approximately 1,600,000 Freemasons; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of
- 15 Pennsylvania (Lodge) was established on June 24, 1731, by

- 1 delegates from the 13 lodges holding charters from the
- 2 Provincial Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The Lodge is one of the oldest Grand Lodges in this
- 4 country; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The Lodge is of the Ancients' tradition and its
- 6 ancestor Grand Lodge is the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted
- 7 Masons of England, which was founded in 1751; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The headquarters of the Lodge is in the Masonic
- 9 Temple at 1 North Broad Street in Philadelphia; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Brother Raymond T. Dietz is the current Grand Master
- 11 of the Lodge; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Freemasonry is a way of life that teaches tolerance
- 13 toward all mankind; and
- 14 WHEREAS, According to the Lodge, "Freemasonry is kindness in
- 15 the home, honesty in business, courtesy in society, fairness in
- 16 work, pity and concern for the unfortunate, resistance towards
- 17 evil, help for the weak, forgiveness for the penitent, love for
- 18 one another and above all reverence and love for God"; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Shriners International, also commonly known as the
- 20 Shriners, is an organization that is an appendant body of
- 21 freemasonry and that operates 20 children's hospitals in the
- 22 United States with two in this Commonwealth, including one in
- 23 Erie and one in Philadelphia, and two children's hospitals in
- 24 Canada and Mexico; and
- 25 WHEREAS, Shriners Hospitals for Children is one of the
- 26 largest pediatric subspecialty health care systems in the world,
- 27 providing specialized care to children with orthopedic
- 28 conditions, burns, spinal cord injuries and cleft lip and
- 29 palate; and
- 30 WHEREAS, The Shriners are dedicated to improving the lives of

- 1 children through innovative care, world-class research and
- 2 outstanding teaching programs for medical professionals; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Each of the 22 children's hospital locations
- 4 specializes in one or more of the broad service lines of
- 5 specialized care, and all care and services are provided to
- 6 children up to 18 years of age regardless of the families'
- 7 ability to pay; and
- 8 WHEREAS, For more than two decades, the Scottish Rite Masons,
- 9 Northern Masonic Jurisdiction, have been national leaders in the
- 10 effort to help children and their families overcome the painful
- 11 obstacles of dyslexia; and
- 12 WHEREAS, With more than 40 dyslexia centers in 13 states, the
- 13 Children's Dyslexia Centers tackle the challenge of dyslexia by
- 14 providing free tutoring for children with dyslexia and by
- 15 training a growing cadre of highly skilled and dedicated tutors;
- 16 and
- 17 WHEREAS, The treatment of dyslexia, which is an inherited
- 18 neurological disorder that affects the way individuals learn to
- 19 read and speak as well as how they process things
- 20 mathematically, is critical to enable individuals to achieve
- 21 fully functional lives; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Dyslexia affects one out of every five individuals
- 23 and affects boys and girls in equal numbers; and
- 24 WHEREAS, The efforts of the Lodge, and freemasonry in
- 25 general, through the Shriners and the Children's Dyslexia
- 26 Centers on behalf of children are invaluable and indispensable;
- 27 therefore be it
- 28 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize and
- 29 honor the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of
- 30 Pennsylvania for its work and commitment to children.
